### GOT-001 CITY OF GOTHENBURG

#### OVERVIEW

### GOT-003 TJOLÖHOLM MANOR

#### OVERVIEW

Embark on an excursion across scenic Swedish countryside, passing unique glacial formations enroute to an Elizabethan-styled manor house overlooking the sea. Your coach voyage begins with a drive to Fjärås Bräcka. This barely-pronounceable, 25-mile-long ridge along Lake Lygnern was formed when inland ice receded some 13,000 years ago, leaving behind one of the most remarkable glacial sea formations in the country. After taking in panoramic views here, you'll continue south from Gothenburg to the peninsula where beautiful Tjolöholm awaits your visit. This fascinating manor house looks like something straight out of 16th-century England yet was built at the turn of the 20th century. The façade is pure Tudor, while the interior is a brilliant example of Art Nouveau design and William Morris craftsmanship. As you tour, you'll learn how this state-of-the-art estate had many comforts far beyond the standards of the day. It was heated by piped hot air, had its own electric generator, and the bathrooms were fitted with showers and sunken baths. The wall-to-wall carpets were kept clean thanks to a horse-drawn vacuum cleaner pulled around outside the house, its thick hoses passed inside through the windows.

#### HIGHLIGHTS

- Travel into the countryside south of Gothenburg, stopping to see unique glacial terrain at Fjärås Bräcka.
- Take an inside tour of Tjolöholm Manor, one of the most curious great houses in all of Sweden.
- Admire the castle's Tudor-era exterior, then be amazed by its far more modern Arts & Crafts interior.
- Learn about this period home's high-tech household comforts – including wall-to-wall carpet kept fluffy by a horse-drawn vacuum cleaner.
- Take some free time after the house tour to enjoy the estate's sea-facing gardens and grounds.

### GOT-004 WEST COAST ISLANDS - PANORAMIC AND WALKING TOUR

#### OVERVIEW

Explore picturesque fjords, islands, inlets and fishing villages both by coach and on foot during this tour of Sweden's sunny west coast. First up as you motor northward from Gothenburg is tranquil Kungälv, a historical town in the foreground of the ruins of 700-year-old Bohus Fortress, invaded 14 times but never successfully. Further up the coast, the lovely offshore islands of Tjörn and Orust are connected to the mainland by impressive bridges – the longest passes over the Askerö Fjord and offers truly spectacular views of the clustered islands around it. Driving on through Tjörn's rural landscape, you'll arrive at the charming cottage-covered fishing village of Klädesholmen, population circa 385. Here the tour shifts gears as you head out on foot for a brief walk that will introduce you to Klädesholmen's history, closely linked to herring fishing. Back on the coach, you'll head for the larger – but still quaintly small – yachting village of Skärhamn where you can take some time to explore at your leisure then relax on the pleasant return drive to Gothenburg pier.

OVERVIEW

This high-adventure tour delivers the thrill of crewing a racing sailboat through Gothenburg's picturesque offshore archipelago. You'll leave the pier headed for Långedrag Marina on your racing yacht. On boarding, you'll receive safety and instructions from the skipper and his sail racing team/crew before commencing on this exhilarating 4-hour experience. The Gothenburg archipelago consists of some 3,000 islands – from large and densely inhabited to tiny islets just one or two shacks. The island collection is split into two parts, north and south, and stretches from Rörö in the north to Vrångö in the south. Renowned for their natural beauty and charming houses created with careful environmental sensitivity, many of the islands are nature reserves with distinctive flora and fauna, lovely sandy beaches and soft dune-like cliffs. As your voyage unfolds, you will have opportunities to hoist the sail and sheet home, grind a winch, trim a jib, punch a stopwatch, or just kick back and relax. A light lunch will be served on board. At the sail's conclusion, you'll sail back to the cruise pier.

OVERVIEW

Treat your senses to historic sites and exceptional flavors during this driving tour of Gothenburg featuring famed Sjömagasinet restaurant. Founded as a small fortified outpost in 1621 by King Gustav II, who wanted to secure Sweden's only western port against frequent Danish raids, Gothenburg soon grew into a trading and maritime powerhouse. Your city expedition includes fabulous views out to the coastal archipelago from high Alvsborg Bridge and a visit to hilltop Masthuggs Church, along with a brief walk in lovely, park-like Gothenburg Botanical Gardens. A stop at Götaplatsen square brings the Museum of Fine Arts, Concert Hall and magnificent 23-foot Poseidon Fountain sculpture into view, while bustling Avenyn leads to Gustav Adolfs Torg, the town square anchored by city hall, the courthouse and the bourse. Following a must-see stop at Gothenburg's legendary Feskekörka Market – that means "Fish Church" in Swedish and the name fits – you'll head for your lunch date at Sjömagasinet, situated at the harbor entrance in a building that dates back to 1775, when the East Indian Trading Company used it as a warehouse. The three-course surprise menu at this much-awarded beacon to Swedish gastronomy will feature local catch of the day.

### KIE-001 OS-HAMBURG & NEUENGAMME

OVERVIEW

Enjoy an enlightening drive through Hamburg and, as a contrast, a sobering visit to the notorious Neuengamme Concentration Camp. During World War II, more than 100,000 people endured horrific conditions at the camp while being forced to work in its brickworks. You will view the factory, the deplorable prison housing, buildings that the SS used and the House of Remembrance, where the names of the prisoners that died are written on white fabric banners. It will be a moving experience and a revealing look into the Nazi mindset. Although much of Hamburg was destroyed in the war, it was beautifully rebuilt, as you will discover by passing landmarks such as Germany’s oldest stock exchange, the opulent 647-room town hall and the Gothic-style warehouse district Speicherstadt. You will also see the exquisite Jungfernstieg shopping promenade, the enormous Baroque church St. Michaelis and the Reeperbahn entertainment district, where the Beatles played long before they became famous.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Get a poignant glimpse into the horrors of World War II at a former concentration camp.
- View the prisoners’ housing and the brickworks where they forced to work.
- Gain an excellent overall understanding of Hamburg on an introductory driving tour.

OVERVIEW

Delve into the extraordinary maritime history of Kiel by visiting its namesake canal and a memorial dedicated to those who died in the World Wars. The canal opened in 1895 and is now the world’s busiest artificial waterway. It connects the North Sea to the Baltic Sea, where you will pause for photos of the Holtenau Locks at the northeastern terminus. It will be fascinating to see how the locks operate and how the canal has been altered over the past century to accommodate more ships. At the Laboe Naval Memorial, you will learn about Germany’s maritime involvement in both World Wars. The shape of the curved brick-clad structure is meant to be inspirational while the naval museum next to it is informational. The museum is housed in a U-boat submarine that Germany surrendered to the Allied troops. Don’t miss the plaque that memorializes the U.S. sailors that served in submarines.

HIGHLIGHTS

- View the locks at one end of the Kiel Canal, the world’s busiest artificial waterway.
- See a soaring monolithic memorial dedicated to those who died in the World Wars.
- Browse artifacts in a naval museum housed in a Germany U-boat submarine.

On the return to Hamburg, you will walk among the locals in the pedestrian tunnel that was built under the Elbe River in 1911. Be sure to notice the decorative tiles depicting sea life. You will also mingle with the residents and get an authentic look at daily life in Hamburg by riding public transportation to the Effenberger Bakery. The owner will then regale you with stories of running the bakery and offer fresh-baked goods.

- Sample traditional products made on the farm and fresh baked goods.

**KIE-003 OS-LUBECKS HANSEATIC HISTORY & STORY**

**OVERVIEW**

Become immersed in the historical and architectural splendor of Lubeck, a major trading center of the Hanseatic League, whose heyday was the 14th and 15th centuries. Despite some damage from World War II, many of Lubeck's most important buildings survived, earning the city a designation as a UNESCO World Heritage site for its historical urban character. The basic structure of the Old Town remains unaltered, including its patrician houses, churches and salt storehouses on the Trave River. 



Visits to the New Ghetto Museum and Old Town’s magnificent Art Nouveau synagogue, a rare war survivor, end the tour on a more uplifting note.

- Savor a mid-ride refreshment break at Fridhem, once the woody summer palace of Princess Eugenie.
- Return to the ship loaded with "pride of the ride," photos to share and stories to tell.

**VBY-2CT CHEF LED LOCAL FARM TOUR & GREENHOUSE LUNCHEON**

OVERVIEW

Your day begins by meeting your Chef in The Culinary Center for an introduction to Swedish cuisine and an overview of today's tour. Discover how local foods are ingeniously sourced by visiting two farms that redefine the Swedish farm-to-table experience. As preparation, your Culinary Center chef will elaborate on Gotland Island's micro-cuisine on the way to Ejmunds Farm, which the same family has owned since 1862. There, you will learn how the farmers humanely raise cattle to produce a highly marbled, exceptionally tender Kobe-like beef that is prized throughout Sweden. The farm also grows organic black truffles beneath hazelnut trees, which were planted specifically to help the truffles thrive in the roots. At Lilla Bjers Farm, another multi-generational enterprise, you will see firsthand how the owners practice organic, sustainable farming. As you walk through the fields with the farmers, they will elaborate on the produce and how it is harvested. Consider this walk an educational sorbet of sorts before proceeding to the greenhouse, a delightful setting for your multi-course lunch of seasonal dishes. After lunch, return to the ship with a glow from being in the fresh farm air today and a new appreciation for this unique rural paradise that has become a 'bucket list' summer destination for food-centric tourism.

- See how Ejmunds Farm humanely produces free-range beef that is similar to Kobe beef.
- Tour Lilla Bjers Farm with the owners as they describe their organic

farming methods.

- Dine on local dishes in the elegant greenhouse at Lilla Bjers Farm.

OVERVIEW

Sightsee in historic Klaipeda Old Town, tour a 19th-century mansion filled with amber, and walk a lively seafront promenade that juts out 1500 feet into the Baltic. A memorable stop will be made at Klaipeda's Theatre Square, where you'll be introduced to its most famous resident, the sculpture of "Annie of Tharau." On a walk through narrow streets, you'll admire the fine old half-timbered fachwerk architecture Klaipeda is known for. A drive north to Palanga brings you to a botanical park where you'll have awhile to stroll forested gardens where swans and other birds float in tranquil ponds. You'll also marvel at another kind of beauty here, inside the splendid neoclassical mansion that once housed a Count and now houses the Amber Museum. Within these walls, thousands of pieces of "Baltic Gold" are on display, including one that weighs in at nearly eight pounds and has been stolen on more than one occasion. Your Palanga tour continues with a stroll along pedestrianized Basanavicius street, both its sides brimming with cafes and bars – leading to a wooden sea pier that extends far out over the Baltic.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Enjoy a sightseeing drive and walk in Old Klaipeda, including Theatre Square and its famous statue.
- Stroll the Palanga Botanical Garden, designed by a top turn-of-the-century French landscape architect.
- Tour the palatial Amber Museum within the park and marvel at the Baltic Gold displayed within.
- Gain insights on how amber is formed, where it is found and how it is worked into fine jewelry.
- Experience the scene along Palanga's Basanavicius street, lined with cafes and leading to a Baltic pier.

HELPFUL HINTS

**KLA-001 LEGENDS OF THE WITCHES HILL**

OVERVIEW

Experience Klaipeda’s world of fairy tales and legends on a tour of the Black Shore, with a stop at Witches Hill. This highly scenic coach journey, punctuated by a 10-minute ferry crossing to reach the famed Curonian Spit, brings you to the town of Juodkrantė. The name means “Black Shore” in Lithuanian, and this once-hopping period resort exudes Old World charm and plenty of quirky superstitious character. You’ll see Amber Bay, where tons of precious prehistoric amber were mined in the 19th-century, and visit a gallery displaying the whimsically colorful “Curonian pennant” weather vanes that became the artistic symbols of the Spit. But the highlight of any Juodkrantė visit is Witches Hill, a site of pagan celebration since ancient times. Along a path through the forest, you’ll encounter some 80 strange and grotesque carved oak sculptures tied to Lithuanian folk tales and legends – including the she-giant Neringa and Egle, queen of the grass-snakes. Your guide will share their long-told stories and several others. On the drive back, stop at the long honey colored shores which have been awarded the Blue Flag and are considered one of the best beaches of the Baltic Sea.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Travel by coach through Klaipeda and out into the shifting-sand dune terrain of the Curonian Spit.
- Tour the old fishing village and resort town of Juodkrantė, which means the Black Shore.
- Take a walk up Witches Hill, where Lithuania’s pagan heritage is alive and well – and carved into wood.
- Visit a gallery of iconic Curonian pennant weather vanes, pass by historic Amber Bay, and see Evangelical Lutheran church.

HELPFUL HINTS

- Wear weather-appropriate clothing.
- Flat athletic or hiking shoes with non-slip soles are recommended.

**KLA-003 SOVIET NUCLEAR WEAPON SITE**

OVERVIEW

Delve into Lithuania’s rugged natural beauty and discover a former nuclear missile bunker that once threatened all of Europe. From the pier, you’ll drive to Zemaitija National Park, deep within sparsely populated Plokstine Forest. Passing magnificent vistas and a crystalline lake, you’ll soon see that this green and remote place was also once home to a lethal secret. Plokstine Missile Base is a stark reminder of the Cold War, its four silos excavated by hand in an-around-the clock effort by thousands of soldiers, conducted across 3 years in total secrecy. Becoming operational in 1963, the R12 Dvina nuclear missiles here were targeted at Europe’s largest cities, including Berlin, London, Madrid and Paris. In 1962, similar missiles

deployed from here to Havana precipitated the Cuban Missile Crisis. Luckily, none were ever fired and Plokstine’s were all removed when the site closed in 1979. Abandoned after the Soviet Union’s collapse, the silos and central control complex were reopened as a Cold War Museum in 2012. During your guided tour of the corridors, mineshaft and deep underground tunnels of this once-hot launch site you’ll even have a chance to climb through a narrow hatch to check out one of the silos.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Travel by panoramic coach through beautiful, unspoiled terrain to Zemaitija National Park.
- Visit what was once a top-secret and sinister facility hidden deep within the Plokstine Forest.
- Tour what’s left of Plokstine Missile Base, from which the Soviets targeted all of Europe with nuclear warheads.
- Explore 88-foot-deep corridors and underground tunnels, even peer into one of the empty launch silos.
- Enjoy some typical Lithuanian dishes and beverages at a lunchtime café stop.

HELPFUL HINTS

- Wear weather-appropriate clothing.
- Flat, comfortable walking shoes are recommended.
- Bring a hat, sunglasses and sunscreen as needed.

PLEASE NOTE

This tour includes approximately 1 mile of walking and 1 hour of standing. There are many thresholds and steps to negotiate at the tunnels. The Soviet Nuclear Weapon Site has not been reconstructed, and there are some uncomfortable areas in the underground tunnels. If you are claustrophobic, do not enter the tunnels. **KLA-004 MANSION, CHURCH, & MONASTERY**

OVERVIEW

Explore Lithuania’s turbulent past and reinvigorated present as you tour Kretinga’s Church of the Annunciation and the historic mansion of Count Tiskevicius. Kretinga is one of Lithuania’s oldest cities – one that suffered immensely during 20th-century occupations by both Soviets and Nazis. You’ll visit the 17th-century Church of the Annunciation and its cellars. Monks from the adjoining Franciscan monastery did much to advance education in early Lithuania, but they were expelled by the Tsarist government and again in Soviet times. After Lithuania’s 1990 declaration of independence, the Franciscans once more returned – and today care for the church. One of the brothers will lead your tour if not at prayer. Another must-see in Kretinga is Count Tiskevicius’ 19th-century estate, which now houses a museum devoted to spiritual and cultural treasures. Here you’ll see a collection of Lithuanian wooden art and countless pieces of equipment used in authentic Lithuanian living and gain insight into what life was like in Kretinga over a century ago. You’ll also learn more about the tragic times when thousands of people, including the Franciscans, were deported to Siberia by the Soviets. Adding a more uplifting note, enjoy light refreshments in the museum’s beautiful winter garden, surrounded by exotic plants.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Travel by panoramic coach to Kretinga, a small and city with ancient roots and turbulent history.
- Tour a medieval red-brick church and adjacent monastery run by Franciscans who have promoted education in Lithuania for centuries.
- Learn of the purges that happened here repeatedly in the last century

OVERVIEW

This enlightening tour reveals Klaipeda's history and life under Soviet rule and explores how amber has shaped the city's fortunes. From the pier, you'll travel past top Klaipeda landmarks like the Clock and Watch Museum, the Gothic Revival post office and a former barracks that now houses Klaipeda University. Lithuania remained under Soviet rule from the end of World War II until it regained independence in 1991. You'll stop for photos at one of Klaipeda's last remaining Soviet memorials and drive through several Soviet-built residential areas. The scenery and your guide's commentary will provide great insight into this long chapter in Lithuania's history. But as influential as that era was, the production of items made from amber has had an even longer – and certainly more positive – impact on Klaipeda. Since ancient times, this fossilized resin from prehistoric pine trees has been used in medicines, perfume and jewelry. It's even found in colors other than amber – including yellow and sometimes red or blue. You'll watch amber artisans creating one-of-a-kind jewelry, see amber antiques, and sip a cup of amber tea while hearing tales of the ancient amber trade route that passed near Old Town.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Enjoy a panoramic overview drive through Klaipeda Old Town, past top historic landmarks.
- Pose for photos at one of the last Soviet memorials in town and see Soviet-era suburbs.
- Learn about amber's long history in Klaipeda and watch artisans crafting it into jewelry.
- Admire amber antiques and even sip tea made from this organic and much-prized substance.

HELPFUL HINTS

- Wear casual, weather-appropriate clothing.
- Flat, comfortable walking shoes are recommended.

OVERVIEW

Paddle a kayak down the serene Minija, admiring gorgeous scenery and discovering what village life is like on a rural Lithuanian river. A leisurely drive through lush countryside begins the adventure, as your guide describes points of interest and provides historical background on Lithuania and how it regained independence from the Soviets in 1991. Your destination is Minija river, which stretches of 202 kilometres and is well know for fishing and kayaking. After a brief orientation session at the launch point, you'll ease into your kayak and out into the river's typically calm waters – free to paddle along at your preferred pace as you take in the Minija scenery and the serenity it offers. Along the way, you might encounter other kayakers or anglers casting for freshwater catch, but the river is usually as uncrowded as it is unspoiled. After experiencing the countryside from this intimate perspective, you'll appreciate the Lithuanian cake and fresh juice served at turn-in all the more.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Enjoy a drive inland across rural Lithuania to a reach a remote village where they rarely drive at all.
- Get oriented and equipped at the launch point, then set out with your guide to paddle down the Minija.
- Take in this tranquil river at your own pace, pausing to listen to the stillness or appreciate the scenery.
- When done, enjoy your Lithuanian cake and fresh juice refreshment with an intimate new appreciation for this lovely country.

Grab your e-bike, ferry across the lagoon that separates Klaipeda from the Curonian Spit, then pedal along its famous sand dunes and discover a rare ecosystem. Departing the pier on your comfortable e-bike, you'll soon be on a 5-minute ferry crossing to the Spit, a long and skinny peninsula of ever-shifting sand dunes. There's much more to it than sand, though – it's a UNESCO World Heritage-listed site because its lagoon settlements have learned so well how to evolve with and protect this fragile environment over the centuries. Your group leader will provide background on all this as you head for Hagen's Dunes, where a stone obelisk commemorates the 19th-century Prussian physicist credited with first planting native flora to help stabilize the dunes' erosion. Following the winding bicycle trail, you'll encounter forest – some planted by Hagen himself, panoramic views of Klaipeda just across the lagoon, and a beautiful beach. You'll also bike past Nerija Fort – a six-sided, 19th-century brick bastion that now defends a maritime museum and aquarium. On reaching the long breakwater jetty, you'll retrace your route and head back into Klaipeda Old Town for some

OVERVIEW

Settle back for a scenic drive that includes photo stops at some of the most notable landmarks in Gdansk. Oliwa Cathedral, dates back to the 13th century but has been destroyed and rebuilt on several occasions since. The current building is a mix of Romanesque, Gothic and Rococo architectural styles, and inside reverberates one of the world's oldest and largest pipe organs. In Gdansk proper, the Green Gate beckons the group to set off briefly on foot, walking to convivial Long Market square with some free time to shop a bit or admire landmark sights like Town Hall or the 15th-century merchants' palace at Artus Court. A drive to Solidarity Square brings you face to face with the monument honoring the shipyard workers gunned down in 1970 by the Communist regime. Nearby, the 90-foot Nowy Port lighthouse is one of the most handsome in Northern Europe. Standing proudly at the entrance to Gdansk harbor, it serves as a coastal light, a harbor pilot's tower and a time ball station similar to the one in Greenwich, England. This archaic device is the ultimate in analog technology but conjures the lost romance of seafaring ship captains and their chronometers perfectly.

Next, you'll drive to the Nowy Port Lighthouse, situated at the entrance of the harbor of Gdansk. This historic lighthouse combined three distinct functions: that of a coastal lighthouse, a harbor pilots tower, and a time ball station. Like in Greenwich, England, the time ball, which measured 5 feet in diameter and weighed 150 pounds, dropped every day at noon to give a precise time signal to the captains of the ships lying at anchor in the Bay of Gdansk. This allowed them to adjust their chronometers, which in turn allowed them later to establish their ship's position (more precisely the longitude) on the open sea. Before returning to the pier, you'll stop for photos at the Oliwa Cathedral. Located on the grounds of an old Cistercian monastery, the cathedral dates back to the 13th century and is a mix of Romanesque, Gothic and Rococo styles. Please note: This tour is mostly panoramic in nature with limited optional walking during stops. Tour is available to wheelchair guests who have a collapsible wheelchair and are able to make their own way on and off transportation. Guests must be self-sufficient or if assistance is required, they should travel with a companion who can provide this. Weather appropriate clothing, adequate sun protection and flat comfortable walking shoes are recommended.
