#### OVERVIEW

OVERVIEW Ride the ferry to Bozcaada and explore this idyllic island whose strategic location at the entrance to the narrow Dardanelles Strait has long influenced its history. Known as Tenedos in ancient times, the island was mentioned several times in "The Iliad," Homer's epic poem written in 800 BC. To protect the island, Ottoman sultan Mehmet II built a foreboding castle in Bozcaada Town in the 15th century. While exploring its interior, you will see excavated Greek amphorae and ancient tombstones. If you walk the ramparts, you will enjoy sweeping views of the marina and town center. Strolling the pedestrian-friendly cobblestone streets in the heart of downtown offers a more intimate view of the atmospheric historic district. You will see homes with Greek and Turkish influences, locals enjoying the leafy plazas and colorful taverns, one of which you will stop in for lunch. During free time, be sure to take advantage of the fine shopping.

#### OVERVIEW

OVERVIEW Walk through the ruins of ancient Assos, a well-preserved historically important city that the Greeks founded in the 7th century BC. Aristotle spend three years in Assos during its heyday, and St. Paul visited centuries later after the city converted to Christianity. Because Assos played such a significant role in the region until the Byzantine period, UNESCO declared it a World Heritage site. Like many Greek cities of the time, it was built on a rocky acropolis, where you will find the remains of a Doric temple dedicated to the goddess Athena. You will also see ancient walls and gates and follow paved roads leading to the ruins of churches and a Greek theatre for as many as 5,000 spectators. Now located within the city of Behramkale, Assos has been continuously excavated since 1980. One of the most recent finds is a monumental Roman fountain, important because previously only cisterns had been unearthed.

- Explore Assos, a vitally important city that was most prosperous in the 4th century BC.
- Visit the Temple of Athena on the acropolis of Assos, which offers panoramic views.

#### OVERVIEW

OVERVIEW Visit battlefields and memorials on the Gallipoli Peninsula that reveal much about the ill-fated World War I campaign that resulted in extraordinarily heavy Allied casualties. On the ferry ride there, you will cross the Dardanelles Strait, which the Allies intended to protect to ensure free passage of their fleet from Europe to Russia. Poor military leadership, inexperienced troops and inadequate equipment all contributed to the disastrous results. You will view some of the watershed battlefields where you can still see the original trenches and tunnels. Their nicknames alone – Hell Spit and Shrapnel Valley – reflect the horrors of the prolonged fighting. There were an estimated 250,000 Allied casualties, many of whom were buried in cemeteries that you will visit. The campaign was such a debacle that Winston Churchill, who was First Lord of the Admiralty at the time, resigned and took a lesser position as a battalion commander in France.
