





OVERVIEW

Take in the highlights of Santa Barbra in this short outing to discover her treasures including free time to browse her quaint streets. From the pier, depart for a scenic drive to the Old Santa Barbara Mission. With its grand double bell towers, lush gardens and the majestic San Ynez mountains as a backdrop, the Mission is one of the city's most picturesque landmarks. Known as "Queen of the Missions" for its exceptional beauty, the Santa Barbara Mission was founded by the Spanish Franciscans in 1786. More than 200 years later, it's still an active parish church and a vital and enduring element of Santa Barbara's cultural landscape. Pause here for photos before continuing to the El Presidio de Santa Barbara State Historic Park to view the remains of the Spanish Outpost built in 1782. Across the street is the unique County Courthouse built in 1929 in the Spanish-Moorish architectural style with its carved doors, special widows, balconies and turrets. From the courthouse you are introduced to State Street in downtown. Here, free time of afforded to explore the city center and browse her streets for treasures or enjoy a café. At the appointed time rejoin your guide for the return to the ship. Note: Wear layered clothing and good walking shoes. Walking during free time is at guests' discretion.

Solvang lies in the heart of Santa Ynez Valley, a fertile region that produces extraordinary wines, especially Chardonnay, Pinot Noir and Syrah. You may recognize the parts of downtown from the wine-tasting road trip movie "Sideways," an Academy Award-winner that was partially filmed in Solvang.





OVFRVIEW

Enjoy a leisurely walk through Santa Barbara with a local architect that will point out and elaborate on the prevalent Mediterranean Mission-style architecture. Although you will only walk about a mile, there will be plenty to see. The architectural style reflects Santa Barbara's Spanish-colonial heritage and Mediterranean climate. Elements such as clay-tiled roofs, white-washed plaster walls and wrought-iron accents became more prominent when the city was rebuilt following an earthquake in 1925. The architect will show you some of the more famous buildings this firm designed, including El Jardin, a mixed-use project with obvious Spanish influences and whimsical features. Ablitt Tower is another distinctive project as the footprint of this vacation-rental residence is a mere 20 x 20 feet. The building could only go up, and it rises spectacularly over an area full of restaurants, shops and nightclubs. The tower's more than 50



Settle in for a full immersion into the world of Santa Barbara wines at the Deep Sea Tasting Room, a delightful venue on Stearns Wharf. The Conway family owns the business and primarily serves Conway wines in the tasting room. As certified sommelier Gillian Conway shares her love of wine, you will gain a deeper understanding of how to properly sample wine, how to choose one to your liking and what wines pair best with certain cuisines. Even wine aficionados will find the experience wonderfully informative and entertaining. You will sample about a half dozen wines, while Gillian describes their characteristics. You might taste a Malbec named for Ringo, the Conway's rescue dog, a crisp "Sea Horse" Sauvignon Blanc with citrusy notes and a fruity "Sea Star" Pinot Noir. All the grapes come from California vineyards, most of them in coastal Santa Barbara, an area that fog and sea breezes typically cool and influence the oceanic terroir.

OVERVIEW

See San Francisco's icons on a leisurely drive up to Twin Peaks, along the

coast to the Golden Gate Bridge and past landmarks such as Fisherman's Wharf. Coastal scrub and lupine cover the peaks, but the draw isn't so much natural beauty as the 180-degree view of the bay area below. Upon descending, you will soon reach Golden Gate Park, an urban oasis with cultural attractions such as the perforated copper-sheathed DeYoung Museum. Your next stop will be the Sutro Baths, a massive swimming facility built at the ocean's edge in 1894. In its heyday, the glamorous baths could accommodate 10,000 people. You will also see San Francisco's most enduring icon, the Golden Gate Bridge. Opened in 1937, the bridge is considered one of the seven engineering wonders of the United States. To round out the tour, you will then drive past Ghirardelli Square and Fisherman's Wharf.

- See San Francisco's marquee attractions, pausing every so often for photos.
- Take in the sweeping view of the bay area from atop Twin Peaks.
- Stop at the remains of a massive historical swimming facility at the ocean's edge.







OVFRVIEW

Explore the naturally beautiful area north of San Francisco within the Muir Woods National Monument and in bayside Sausalito. Not long after driving over the Golden Gate Bridge, the countryside becomes more rural and forested, one of its highlights being the towering redwood trees in Muir Woods. During free time, you can hike the winding trails through the old-growth forest at your own pace. You won't have to go far to be awed by the gorgeous setting. It is America's first national monument on land that an individual donated. A bit farther south, you will stop in Sausalito, a wonderfully atmospheric bayside town. Its name derives from an indigenous Coast Miwok word for the little willows that once grew along the creeks. During free time in Sausalito, you might shop along the waterfront, meander down the cobblestone streets or simply admire the views of the bay and the San Francisco skyline in the distance.

OVERVIEW

Explore the infamous and stark penitentiary on Alcatraz Island and then continue across the Golden Gate Bridge to lovely Sausalito, a small bayside town with extraordinary shopping. On the ferry to Alcatraz Island, the site of the federal penitentiary known as "The Rock," you will learn about its history and notorious inmates such as Al Capone and the Birdman of Alcatraz. Watch mesmerizing La Bufadora blowhole spew seawater high into the air, discover the historical side of Ensenada and shop along the main thoroughfare. You will find the blowhole, one of the world's largest marine geysers, on the Punta Banda peninsula. It shoots water as high as 65 feet, a continuous natural spectacle caused by the ocean's waves being forced into a partially submerged cave with only one exit—a hole at the top. Back in Ensenada, you will tour the Hotel Riviera del Pacifico, a Spanish-style resort built in 1930 with an on-site casino. The infamous Al Capone was supposedly a regular and may have funded its construction. You will also enjoy two opportunities to shop. One at an open-air market; the other along the main boulevard of Lopez Mateos. As you browse the inviting boutiques, you will find a collection of art, perfumes, fine leather goods and casual clothing.




Explore some of the landmarks in Ensenada before visiting a tequila factory where you will discover the subtleties and varieties of this iconic Mexican spirit. Depending on the exact route downtown, you may pass the bustling boardwalk along All Saints Bay, see the massive Mexican flag that rises more than 350 feet above the aptly named Flag Plaza, and admire the fabulous Hotel Riviera del Pacifico. This Spanish-style resort was built in the 1930s and the margarita is said to have been invented here. How fitting, as you will next visit a factory that produces tequila, the key ingredient in margaritas. While touring the revered Tequilera Doña Engracia Ensenada, you will discover the differences between the various spirits by sampling the brand's silver, reposado and añejo tequilas. Three additional liquors will also be served.
