PCP-001 PANAMA CANAL EXPERIENCE

OVERVIEW

Ride a ferry through several locks in the Panama Canal while enjoying a hearty buffet lunch and some of the most spectacular views in Panama. Once you settle into the spacious ferry, you will cruise north, passing through the Miraflores locks, which will raise the vessel 56 feet to allow it to enter Miraflores Lake. Ahead lie the Pedro Miguel locks, where the water will once raise the ferry so it can enter Gatun Lake, the world's largest man-made lake. You will then cross the Continental Divide and continue on to Gaillard Cut, an excavated gorge more than eight miles long. The soil here was originally unstable, causing landslides that made construction all the more demanding. Excavations continue today to ensure that the canal will remain open. You will see some of the gargantuan floating cranes used to dredge the canal upon arriving in Gamboa, where you will receive a certificate commemorating your canal crossing.

- Cruise through several locks in the Panama Canal on a partial transit.
- Watch the water in the locks raise your vessel through an extraordinary feat of engineering.
- Pass through the world's largest manmade lake.
- See some of the massive equipment that keeps the canal dredged and open to traffic.

As you will discover, the French and Spanish architecture throughout the city is extraordinary. Highlights include the Metropolitan Cathedral, whose entrance is flanked by two signature bell towers, and the cross-shaped National Theatre. Another point of interest is the wall engraving at Las Bovedas that recount the French attempt to construct the Panama Canal in the 1880s.

OVERVIEW

Observe the wilds of Soberania National Park from an aerial tram high above the rainforest floor and from atop an observation tower that offers an entirely different perspective. The aerial tram leaves from the contemporary Gamboa Rainforest Resort in the heart of the national park, a wonderfully natural and unspoiled setting. As you ascend from the forest's shaded understory into the sunnier tree canopy, the types of vegetation and animals will change. Mammals such as coatis and capybaras may be spotted at ground level, while sloths, howler monkeys and tropical birds are often seen in the higher altitudes. The ride will offer a spectacular overview of the rainforest that seems to go on forever. Later, you will have the opportunity to climb an observation tower for a different 360°-view of the wilderness. You might also browse the resort's butterfly farm, orchid garden and serpentarium.

OVERVIEW

A scenic 45-minute drive inland will bring you to the Gamboa Rainforest Reserve for an eco-cruise on Gatun Lake. As the world's largest manmade lake, Gatun is teeming with wildlife, especially water birds. You will also likely spot all sorts of monkeys on aptly named Monkey Island, which is inhabited by howler, Capuchin and tamarin monkeys. You may also enjoy up-close views of ships transiting the canal.

Still, the highlight is seeing the locks in action from an elevated observation platform. Afterwards, you will travel to Fort Clayton, the former U.S. Army base for the Southern Command Headquarters. An enlightening tour will provide insight on how the troops lived and their mission at the time. You will also drive past the former Albrook Air Force Base, parts of which have been converted into a high-end commercial and residential area that includes an airport.

the area's diverse climate ranges. Upon arrival, access to Taironaka is done via a pleasant 20- minute walk along an ecological path, during which you will start to appreciate the flora and fauna of the region. However, the Taironaka, Ecological Tourism and Archeology site offers that and much more. Here, in this landscape nestled in the foothills of the Sierra Nevada of Santa Marta, you will have the opportunity of walking through what used to be the stone paved city of Tairona. You will see paths, aqueducts, stairs, terraces and much more. You may even see a piece of a Tairona vessel or remains of grinding stones whose wonderful rounded stones were created for a purpose that is still unknown. There were many items that this incredible culture manufactured during the hundreds of years that they dwelled on this mountain; and many of them remain. The Spaniards who came and assaulted the Taironas while looking for gold objects, took the gold, but they left the clay, the stone and what remains of the city today. Due to its climate and fertile soil, the area started off cultivating colorful tropical flowers that are sold to international markets and which can be observed everywhere within the reserve. Today, it has also become a sanctuary for the archeological treasures of the Tairona culture which are more than a thousand years old. The museum here showcases pieces of great value and also enlightens visitors on how the Taironas lived and how they were remarkable goldsmiths, craftsmen, sailors and warriors. Following the guided portion of your tour, you are free to explore further on your own, or perhaps take a swim in the river. There is a restaurant at the Reserve where guests may purchase lunch. After approximately 2 hours, you'll walk with your guide back to your minibus and travel back to the ship.

Bon Bini na Bonaire! Enjoy a brisk round-the-town welcome to Kralendijk from the comfort of an electric-powered Tuk-Tuk, enjoying the open air and sights. On this island, the three-wheeled mini-taxis don't make the "tuk tuk" sound of the famous Thai version – because this Caribbean version is electric, eco-friendly and noiseless. All the better for the scenic environment you'll be touring, and to hear the enlightening commentary by your local driver/guide. One of the top sights you'll encounter in this orientation ride is heavily fortified Fort Orange, built in 1639 for attacks that never came. It still has its cannons, just in case. Another highlight is the delightful Dutch architecture widespread in this island capital city whose name means "coral dike" in that language. You'll also see Bonaire's largest church and may have a chance to view the saltwater flats where flamingoes sometimes congregate in the shallows to scoop up brine shrimp with their upside-down beaks and backwards knees. That diet is what gives them their trademark rosy-orange hue. Once the tuk-tukking is done, you'll be dropped back at the pier.

- Hop aboard an eco-friendly electric Tuk-Tuk mini-taxi for an orientation

spin around Kralendijk.

- Enjoy your equally-friendly driver/guide's commentary about the sights you're seeing.

Head into the arid wilds of the Washikemba reserve on an All-Terrain Vehicle and experience a hauntingly beautiful landscape. A brief coach ride brings you to the pick-up point, where you'll get your safety check-out before taking off eastward toward Washikemba. Four-wheeling your way into this rugged region, you'll reach areas most normal vehicles can't – letting you encounter Bonaire in its most natural, undisturbed state. You might even see wild donkeys and goats, and iguanas basking in the sun. At the amazingly remote Spelonk Lighthouse, marking the island's easternmost point, you can't help but notice that the only other way here is by sketchy footpath. And it's sure to be an inspiring moment when you also realize that the only sound you can hear here is surf crashing on a rocky shore. Once you've absorbed that awhile, it's on to one of Bonaire's many caves, some still bearing inscriptions from Arawak Indians who lived here in pre-Columbian days. Today's cave residents are likely to be bats, clinging to the roof in great numbers as they wait for dusk to fly off in search of tasty insects. It's a good thing your dinner plans are elsewhere.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Experience Bonaire's arid landscape in its natural state in the Washikemba reserve.
- Make your way there by All-Terrain Vehicle, which can take you where other vehicles can't.
- Find yourself at a far-off lighthouse where the only sound is the ocean, or maybe a wild goat.
- Visit a cave where ancients might once have lived, but now only bats. Lots and lots of bats.
- See other wild places, including a remote settlement at the head of the reserve's sea lagoon.

Pedal across Bonaire’s relatively flat countryside, admiring the island’s natural beauty and observing daily life here in the tropics. A drive through Kralendijk brings you to the departure point where you’ll be set up with your mountain bike to begin this 12-mile cycling adventure that passes an array of classic Bonaire sights. Capture panoramas at Tolo Beach, a spectacular stretch of sand also known as Ol’ Blue. Admire the dilapidated charm of Landhouse Karpata, a former plantation that raised goats, grew aloe and produced charcoal – now gone to seed. You might see wild donkeys lazing about; they’ve been island residents ever since Spaniards brought their ancestors here 500 years ago. Ahead lies Goto Lake, a favorite gathering place for Bonaire’s flamingoes. They feed in the saltwater shallows here, using their upside-down beaks to scoop up brine shrimp – a diet that gives them their trademark rosy-orange hue. Stopping at Dos Pos, a drinking well at a nearby plantation, you’re likely to spot other birds including lively yellow bananaquits. Once at Rincon, the island’s oldest town, you’ll take a well-earned outdoor rest at the Rose Inn, then leave your wheels behind and hop aboard ours for the return drive to Kralendijk.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Get fitted and head out for 12 miles of freewheeling tropical exploration by mountain bike.
- Pedal along a coastal path that also turns inland after rounding a flamingo-favored salt lake.
- Pass beautiful beachfront and wander an abandoned old plantation.
- Be on the lookout for wild donkeys and stop by a drinking well that birds frequent.
- At the ride’s end, enjoy a rest break in Rincon and a lift by coach back to the ship.

OVERVIEW

Travel off-road in a 4x4 Land Rover to explore Bonaire’s remote eastern shore, a land of giant cacti, plentiful wildlife and stunning natural beauty. You’ll head out from the pier and drive through Kralendijk. As you get further east, you’ll notice the land getting more rugged. Before long, the paved highway will be in the rearview as you enter trackless, arid

countryside. This sparsely populated part of the island is both beautiful and rugged. You’re usually more likely to encounter wild donkeys, Caribbean parakeets, yellow-shouldered parrots or prehistoric-looking iguanas than humans around here. One exception is when you reach Sorobon Beach, catering to windsurfers who can’t resist the waves kicked up by the steady offshore breezes. After a pause, you’ll press on to pass one of Bonaire’s five lighthouses then clustered stone huts that once housed slaves who worked in the surrounding salt flats until slavery was brought to an end here in 1863. These saltwater shallows are a known place where Bonaire’s flamingoes gather to feed, using their upside-down beaks to scoop up brine shrimp – the unique diet responsible for their trademark rosy-orange hue. Perhaps they’ll be hungry when you’re passing through.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Explore an arid, undeveloped part of Bonaire where the scenery is all about rugged beauty.
- Be on the lookout for wild donkeys, chattering parrots, and iguanas lounging in the sun.
- Stop at a faraway, breeze-swept beach where the waves are irresistible to windsurfers.
- Visit salt flats where flamingoes often congregate to feed, and stand around on one leg.

HELPFUL HINTS

- Wear light-weight clothing.
- Flat, closed-toe shoes are required.
- Bring a hat, sunglasses and sunscreen.

PLEASE NOTE

You might see parrotfish, angelfish, sea horses and turtles, all gracefully swimming through their world, undisturbed by your presence. Relax in whatever way you please; there’s no set schedule. After about an hour you’ll tender back to the Samur to enjoy tropical fruits and rum punch on the return sail.

If you do opt to jump in and investigate the goings-on, expect to see longsnout seahorses and a full spectrum of colorful reef fish like wrasses, grunts, goatfish, parrotfish and tangs. Sea turtles also thrive here in the protected park waters. This optional snorkeling is unguided, but a crew member will be keeping a watchful eye out from the deck. After about an hour at anchor, the sails will be raised again for the voyage back to harbor, with an open bar en route.

The onboard naturalist can help with fish identification or questions, and there are illustrated Caribbean fish charts on board as well. After about 75 minutes spent surveying this marvelous environment, you'll return to the pier. Dry and content.

As revealing as these architectural insights will be, few experiences will be quite so revealing as listening to the museum’s historical actors describe what life was like in the past. You may hear about the Dutch colonizers, how slavery was abolished and the origins of the island’s traditions. The exhibits cover more than 7,000 years of history through artifacts recovered from shipwrecks, 3D reconstructions, descriptive timelines and historical photographs. After browsing the museum, you will have time for shopping at a market near the harbor.

- Gain an understanding of how the Dutch have influenced Bonaire since the 17th century.
- Listen to costumed historical characters tell stories of their past lives on Bonaire.

Once you settle in on the elevated seat toward the aft of the raft, the guide will begin poling the handmade vessel downstream, while providing enlightening commentary about the local folklore and history. Bamboo rafting in Jamaica originated on the river centuries ago to transport produce such as bananas from the interior plantations to the coast for export. Although only a few feet wide, bamboo rafts stretch about 30 feet long and feature extraordinarily shallow drafts so they can easily negotiate virtually any part of the river.
