You can expect the gardens to be a riot of color with indigenous plants that include the delicate, pale-yellow orchid that is the national flower of Honduras. The bird sanctuary will also be ablaze in color as macaws and parrots are abundant. If you are feeling adventurous, you might hold one of the monkeys in the refuge or simply watch them swinging from branch to branch in the trees. Another highlight is Coxen's Cave, which holds replicas of items that pirates once used.

OVERVIEW

Kayak through the wildlife-rich waters of Gatun Lake with the option of climbing an observation tower to watch the Gatun locks in the Panama Canal operate. Workers created the lake by building a large earthen wall to hold back the waters of the Chagres River during the construction of the canal. Although several villages had to be abandoned when the water rose, the resulting lake was a boon for the flora and fauna. As you will see firsthand while kayaking, the lake's biodiversity is remarkable. You may hear howler monkeys screeching in the surrounding jungle and might even see them gazing down at you from the tree branches. Panama's national bird, the harpy eagle, is also commonly spotted around the lake. Following your kayaking adventure, you can climb to the top of an observation tower, if you are so inclined. It offers a great vantage point to watch ships pass through the Gatun locks.
