CER-004 D-DAY LANDING BEACHES
Date: May 25, 2026 Time: 07:15 AM

OVERVIEW
Pay your respects to the brave and never forgotten, as you spend a day visiting Normandy's most moving and significant D-Day invasion sites. Visit Omaha Beach, where perhaps the most terrifying landing of all took place as some 2,000 U.S. soldiers perished, many before even reaching the sand. At Pointe du Hoc, stand before a simple granite monument commemorates the spot where Army Rangers scaled a 100-foot cliff by rope ladder to disarm German artillery positions aimed at the Omaha landing operation. In the village of Arromanches, tour a museum where remnants of an ingenious Mulberry Harbor can still be seen; these improvised floating piers and roadways allowed crucial arms and supplies to be offloaded without using existing ports heavily defended by the Germans. And at Colleville Saint Laurent, walk amongst the sea of white crosses and Stars of David that mark the final resting place of nearly 9,400 soldiers who paid the ultimate sacrifice during the Normandy campaign. The names of another 1,5567 are forever inscribed on the site's Wall of the Missing memorial. Overall, this excursion is a pilgrimage that any freedom-loving traveler will find deeply moving.

- Enjoy a scenic two-hour drive across Normandy to the seaside village of Arromanches.
 - Tour the D-Day Museum where the remains of a Mulberry Harbor can still be seen, and exhibits include working operations models and an exceptional archival film presentation.

 - Stand humbled at Omaha Beach and Pointe du Hoc, where heroic and horrific events unfolded.

OVERVIEW
Journey to one of the most visually iconic sites in France, the islet of Mont Saint Michel, world-renowned for its medieval town and namesake abbey. It's a 2.5-hour investment to get there, but the drive through Normandy is pleasant – and seeing this cone-shaped masterpiece of Middle Ages architecture in person is an absolute bucket list experience. Connected to the mainland by the skinniest of land bridges and protected by some of the most volatile tides in Europe, this tiny fortified bastion is capped with a

spectacular abbey encircled by its medieval town and the sea. Follow your guide through the tiny streets of the walled village, up to the abbey, cloister and terrace. Then, enjoy some free time for an independent exploration. May be, learn about the Mont's famous galloping tides and unique marine ecosystem at the Maritime Museum. Browse the ancient weapons and artifacts at Grévin Museum or discover how the locals lived in medieval times at Tiphaine's House, built in 1365 and decorated with smart period furnishings. A casual stroll of the winding Grand Rue, a bit narrow for its name, invites window-browsing at the traditional French shops. Charming cafés and patisseries along here provide tempting options for a casual lunch.

- Settle in for a scenic ride across Normandy to the diminutive UNESCO-listed islet of Mont St Michel.
 - Enjoy a guided exploration of this walled medieval village , up to the abbey, cloister and terrace.

OVERVIEW
Venture into La Hague to explore the unspoiled villages of a wildly beautiful peninsula that retains its traditional way of life. It's barely 20 miles, as the crow flies, from Cherbourg to the outer tip of the Cotentin headlands, but like the best of journeys, the magic is all about what you'll encounter along the way. The landscape here is diverse and breathtaking – steep granite cliffs, hidden coves, leafy green valleys and small, well-tended fields. Approaching Port Racine, you may see goats and cows grazing cliff-top pastures. France's tiniest port, this immensely picturesque village is all stone houses, seaside cafés and colorful fishing boats bobbing in the harbor. Seldom-visited Goury offers equal charm, along with a towering off-shore lighthouse and beautiful crescent-shaped beach. The rugged coastal cliffs surrounding remote Nez de Jobourg village are among the highest in Europe. If the day is clear, look for the Channel Islands shimmering in the distance. Also look for avian inhabitants; this region is a sanctuary for gulls, cormorants and fulmars, who nest in large colonies on the craggy bluffs.

CER-001 BAYEUX & THE BAYEUX TAPESTRY

OVERVIEW

Travel to Bayeux to behold what is surely the world's most famous tapestry, an 11th-century treasure depicting a decisive moment in European history. While the beaches north of Bayeux are best known for the world-changing invasion of June, 1944, the priceless woven masterwork that hangs in the Museum of Tapestry portrays the Norman Invasion of 1066, which also happened here. That this thing hangs at all is quite an accomplishment, given that it's a 230-foot-long piece of linen and wool – big and fantastic enough to have earned its own UNESCO designation. The tapestry's multicolored threads present over 70 scenes in immense detail, including hundreds of figures and animals, buildings and ships, all surrounded by a border decorated with creatures from Aesop's Fables. Embroidered nearly 950 years ago, it's an absolute wonder that's somehow remained intact for nearly a millennium. After your tapestry viewing session, take some free time for lunch in this town of stunning medieval architecture. Later, you'll rejoin your guide and visit iconic Bayeux Cathedral, large enough to have shown off the tapestry in its ornate nave back in the 1400s.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Enjoy a scenic 90-minute coach journey to Bayeux, a lovely Normandy town of cobbled streets and rich medieval history.
- Visit the town's namesake treasure, the 230-foot Bayeux Tapestry embroidered circa 1092, now in a museum dedicated to its display.
- Marvel at the sheer size of this masterwork of linen and wool as you learn about where it's been and how it has survived.
- Take some free time for lunch and sightseeing on your own in Bayeux.
- Before the ride back to Cherbourg, visit the Bayeux Cathedral – as ancient as the tapestry it once held.

OVERVIEW

Get an intimate perspective on the wonders of this charming French seaside city, as you wander with us through Cherbourg's historic center. Your leisurely walking tour begins right from the harbor; its signature breakwater was an ambitious project begun during the reign of Louis XVI and continued by Napoleon. Once completed midway through the 1800s, the fully protected harbor helped transform the city into the major commercial and military port it still is today. But then, Cherbourg had already been an important Norman city for centuries by then, and its architecture reflects that heritage. This wide-ranging walk will bring you past some fine examples, including Holy Trinity Church, built in the Flamboyant Gothic style that was all the rage in the 14th and 15th centuries. Once the guided portion of your excursion is done, take some free time to explore further on your own – or perhaps visit the fascinating maritime museum complex that creatively explores Cherbourg's deep ties to the sea. La Cité de la Mer is located right in the harbor it celebrates.

- Take a guided walking tour of Cherbourg, a bustling port city with a charming historic center.
- See landmarks like Holy Trinity Church, a textbook example of France's Flamboyant Gothic style.

OVERVIEW

Head into the Cotentin Peninsula to explore picturesque villages of the Saire Valley, a bucolic region on the tip of Normandy. The 75-minute drive from Cherbourg zips by panoramically as you travel across this fertile region boasting more than thirty quaint villages – many dating back to the Middle Ages. In Barfleur, you'll find yourself in the same lovely fishing village from which William the Conqueror departed to England in 1066. The rest, i.e. the whole Norman Invasion thing, is history. Fishing boats laden with oysters, lobsters and shrimp still arrive in Barfleur harbor daily, and France's oldest national lifeboat station continues to rescue local sailors in distress, as it has since 1865. Spectacularly scenic Saint Vaast la Hougue, some 15 minutes to the south, is dominated by its 17th century seaside fortress. Designed by King Louis XIV's military engineer, this was one of a chain of coastal bastions meant to protect France from maritime invaders. On your town tour, you'll learn about its role in a famous 1692 naval battle and 1944 liberation by the Allies soon after the Normandy landing. Oh, and its renowned oysters.

OVERVIEW

Meander through two enchanting gardens in the Normandy region, both displaying a collection of subtropical plants that don't normally grow in this part of France. Thanks to the proximity of the warming Gulf Stream, this area enjoys a mild climate that encourages plants to flourish, as you will discover at Vauville Botanic Garden. As you stroll the winding paths, you may pass through France's northernmost palm grove, see a riot of blooming azaleas and catch the scent of towering eucalyptus trees wafting through the air. Not far away you will find an English-style garden that complements Château de Nacqueville. It was designed in the early 19th century to reflect a romantic park with a gently flowing stream, waterfalls and two ponds. Rhododendrons, hydrangeas and azaleas add splashes of color. Political scientist and historian Alexis de Tocqueville described the garden as "one of the prettiest places on Earth," and you may well agree after meandering the grounds.

- Walk the winding paths of two gardens that greatly benefit from the warming Gulf Stream.
- See a huge variety of rare and exotic plants that don't normally grow in Normandy.
- Discover the origins of the gardens and how and why they have been altered over time.

CER-006 SAINTE MER EGLISE AND UTAH BEACH

OVERVIEW

Visit several World War II landmarks, including Utah Beach, the first village liberated by Allied troops on D-Day and an artillery bunker built by the Nazis. A scenic drive south of Cherbourg leads to the charming French country village of Sainte-Mère-Eglise. Once known mostly for its livestock, it became forever famous after the evening of June 5, 1944, when American paratroopers landed and immediately engaged in a battle to make this Normandy's first village liberated from German occupation. You'll see the "Milestone Zero" marker and other monuments that commemorate the valor of these airborne liberators. Moving closer to the coast, the drive will wind through Sainte-Marie-du-Mont, near where the 506th Parachute Infantry Regiment famously dropped in behind enemy lines on June 6, heroically making their way to Utah Beach. You'll make your way there, too, to salute the very shoreline where over 20,000 Allied troops landed on D-Day. At tiny Saint-Marcof, you'll stop to see the remains of Crisbecq artillery battery, part of Germany's Atlantic Wall coastal defenses. Guns from this battery were responsible for the sinking of the USS Corry during a fierce D-Day exchange.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Take a guided walk in Sainte-Mère-Eglise, considered the first Normandy village liberated by the Allies.
- See where the fighting happened and the markers that commemorate the heroic U.S. paratroopers involved.
- Pass through another village, Sainte-Marie-du-Mont, where American soldiers parachuted in behind enemy lines and fought their way to Utah Beach.
- Visit the unforgettable Utah Beach landing site, where so much horror and heroism took place.
- Stop to see what's left of the Crisbecq artillery battery and bunker, built by the Nazis and responsible for the sinking of a US destroyer during the D-Day battle.

OVERVIEW

Browse the Caen Memorial Museum and gain a deeper understanding of World War II with special emphasis on the nearby D-Day landings and the Battle of Normandy. Although Caen is revered for the locally quarried yellow limestone used throughout downtown, the city's most notable attraction is still the memorial. Dedicated to peace, yet focused on the horrors of war, the memorial museum pays special attention to World War II as Caen was the first large French city liberated following the D-Day invasion. The museum's façade is purposefully stark and flat with a small entry door, a design meant to symbolize the Allies breaking through the Nazis' supposedly impenetrable coastal defense system known as the Atlantic Wall. You will be free to browse the areas of most interest to you. The exhibits are graphic and extraordinarily moving, particularly those that

Enjoy an enlightening tour of Dunkirk and then head to the village of Esquelbecq to sample a variety of locally brewed beers. Heavy bombing during World War I and II was especially devastating, yet several key World Heritage sites remain, including a medieval belfry and the town hall. A bit inland and due south, you will find the community of Esquelbecq and the Brasserie Thiriez brewery. Following a behind-the-scenes look at the brewing process, you will taste a selection of beverages that craft beer pioneer Daniel Thiriez brews there. One of them may be a golden saison made with a signature yeast that significantly influences its flavor. Another possibility is the best-selling Blonde d'Esquelbecq, a beer with citrus notes.

- Take a panoramic drive through Dunkirk, an ancient port with two World Heritage sites.
- Tour the pioneering brewery Brasserie Thiriez in the inland community of Esquelbecq.
- Sample an inspiring selection of signature beers with distinct characteristics.

You will initially browse the 1940 Museum, which occupies the headquarters of the French and Allied forces during the Battle of Dunkirk and Operation Dynamo. Through the collection of historical photographs, maps and military equipment, you will gain insight into this critical period of the war. You will also learn about the Wereldmuseum, an ethnographic museum that tells a similar story of urban evolution but through moving human experiences. The wonders of contemporary life are brilliantly depicted in the Eye Film Museum, discover the story behind this masterpiece the area was primarily an industrial and port zone, selected as part of an effort to revitalize and transform this industrial area into a vibrant cultural space. This prominent structure is considered one of the masterpieces of the 21st century.
