When you arrive to the old town you'll enjoy a guided walking tour through the Old Town's most popular spots where you will learn historical and cultural facts about this astonishing town!

Zipping along its rocky coast in a speedboat will be an exhilarating experience, especially on the approach to the Blue Cave. Expect to be awed by the brilliant blue water and the hue that it casts on the cave's interior, both the result of the way the sunlight reflects off the sandy bottom of the sea. You will have the opportunity to swim in this enchanting setting before zipping off to Rose Beach on the tip of the Lustica Peninsula. Sheltered by the surrounding mountains and forests, the water there is typically calm.

You will then pause for a refreshing cup of gelato and walk down narrow Via San Cesareo, whose alleyways are lined with a collection of artisan workshops. The ambiance couldn’t be more inviting as you join the local residents browsing for merchandise such as fine leather goods, embroidered clothes and lemon products. Following a coffee break in a traditional café, you will enjoy free time to explore further.

- Explore the maze of shop-lined alleyways in Sorrento’s romantic old quarter.
- Take in the spectacular view of the bay and Mt. Vesuvius from a clifftop urban park.
- Mingle with the locals while enjoying coffee, gelato and shopping for artisan merchandise.
