



OVERVIEW

After a scenic drive across the Normandy countryside, visit a museum dedicated to peace in a town that endured - and survived - one of WWI's fiercest battles. Caen is barely 10 miles inland from the Normandy beaches, and control of this medieval university city quickly became strategic to both sides after the June 1944 landings. With the Germans stubbornly entrenched in defensive position, Caen was subjected to a month of intense Allied bombardment and shelling - with the loss of thousands of civilian lives and three-quarters of the city's buildings. The Caen Memorial was created as a place for reflecting on war and reconciliation in a larger sense than even the unforgettable events that happened here. It is a museum that explores the nature of conflict - and commemorates peace. Utilizing a participatory approach to presents the stakes involved in the Second World War and the course and significance of its outcome, you will be immersed in a multimedia, historical setting that brings the action vividly to life.

OVERVIEW

This moving excursion focuses on the dramatic history of World War I and the battles fought in and around Ypres and Flanders Fields. Made forever and hauntingly - famous by the words of the poem In Flanders Fields by Canadian Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, the endless trench warfare battles fought without decisive victories in these poppy fields left 1,200,000 injured and 500,000 dead – and have come to symbolize the meaningless slaughter of war. You'll visit one of the British cemeteries and see the Menin Gate Memorial with the names of over 50,000 missing soldiers engraved on its walls. Your tour of award-winning Flanders Fields Museum will make it clear this is no normal war museum; its innovative exhibits capture the human stories of ordinary soldiers, nurses, fugitives and children who endured this war where "new" weapons like gas, land mines and missiles wreaked horrific destruction. You'll also visit Essex Farm Cemetery, where the author of In Flanders Fields was inspired to write his now-famous poem in 1915 after witnessing the burial of his friend lost in battle. Midway through the excursion, free time will be taken for lunch and shopping at your leisure in Ypres.





OVERVIEW

Meander through a compact area within the heart of Bruges, while admiring the medieval and Gothic architecture that earned the city a UNESCO World Heritage site designation. As a historical introduction, you will first pause at Sint-Janshuismolento, an iconic windmill built in 1770. Ahead lies atmospheric Market Square, the 13th-century Belfry Tower and the Basilica of the Holy Blood in Burg Square, which supposedly contains a cloth with the blood of Jesus. Canals are synonymous with Bruges and perfect spots to snap photos, especially where two canals converge at Rosary Quay. Other stops will be made at an unusual bar where more than 1,000 different Belgium beers are displayed and at the Rooms Convent, an almshouse founded in 1330. Then, there is Katelijnestraat, the ultimate street for shopping. Initially, the guide will show you around, after which you will be free to browse the stores for items such as handmade Belgium lace.
