





OVERVIEW

Enjoy an excellent introduction to Montreal that presents its most memorable attractions and an historical overview of the city. You will first visit Notre-Dame Basilica, which when completed in 1829 was North America's largest house of worship. The interior is stunning, especially the exquisite gold-leaf woodwork and glorious high altar. You will next pass copper-domed St. Joseph's Oratory. Perched on the slopes of Mount Royale, it draws pilgrims worldwide that come to pray for healing. The city's natural beauty is best expressed at Mount Royal Park, parts of which were originally landscaped by Frederick Law Olmsted, who designed New York's Central Park. Being the highest point in the city, the park affords wonderful views of Montreal's skyline, the St. Lawrence River and the surrounding countryside. For yet another perspective of Montreal, you will drive through Golden Square Mile, where the wealthiest families built Victorian and Renaissance homes more than a century ago.

- · Receive a wonderfully enlightening overview of Montreal by driving through much of town.
- Visit Notre-Dame Basilica, Canada's first Gothic Revival-style church.
- Enjoy sweeping views of the city and beyond from the urban oasis Mount Royal Park.

OVFRVIFW

Enjoy an enlightening walk through Old Town, a wonderfully compact area of grand architecture wedged between the St. Lawrence River and Montreal's modern downtown. It won't take long to reach the heart of Old Town, a once-walled area where Montreal was founded in 1642. As you stroll the cobbled streets with your guide, you will see icons such as the Notre-Dame Basilica, Canada's first Gothic Revival-style church, and the 17th-century Place d'Armes, a square in front of the basilica where the French military once paraded. You will also see Montreal's 19th-century courthouse and the city hall, which was rebuilt after a fire in 1922 destroyed everything but the exterior walls. Montreal also has its share of noteworthy modern buildings such as the Palais des Congrès convention center and the dazzling World Trade Center, which occupies a full city block. The latter is an architectural triumph of historical buildings linked by a glassed-covered promenade.

- Walk past Old Montreal's key landmarks with a guide that will elaborate on their significance.
- Pause to admire a basilica that was North America's largest house of worship when built in 1829.
- View ornate municipal buildings that include the first courthouse and the historical city hall.

Although the items will depend on what's freshest and seasonal, they will likely include delectable cheeses, maple-flavored products and artisanal confections such as macarons. As you walk along the cobblestone streets, stopping in shops that now occupy the former brick warehouses, you may be offered a taste of pâté on a French baguette, slow-smoked meats, exotically flavored gelatos and natas, a traditional puff pastry of Portuguese origin. The enticing aromas of these freshly prepared items will only add to the culinary experience and further whet your appetite. Along the way, the guide will provide commentary about Montreal's distinctive cuisine and how people such as the indigenous Amerindians have influenced it. The 1967 International and Universal Exposition held in Montreal also left its mark on the foodie scene as it exposed Canadians to an array of ethnic cuisine.





OVERVIEW

Paddle a kayak along the smooth-as-glass waters of the Saguenay Fjord, looking for seals and other marine life in the unspoiled wonderland. After a scenic drive, you will arrive at the Saguenay National Park, the first park in the province dedicated to protecting marine life. You will then ease into a two-person kayak and start paddling along the shores of Cape Trinity. Receding glaciers carved the waterway out of rock centuries ago, leaving behind sheer cliffs and one of the province's most spectacular settings. Seals and marine birds are also prevalent in the pristine Cape Trinity area, so be sure to scan the waters as you paddle along. Afterwards, you might shop in the Visitor center.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Kayak through the typically calm, unspoiled waters off Cape Trinity.
- Natural Beauty: Marvel at the sheer cliffs and breathtaking scenery that make Cape Trinity one of Quebec's most spectacular settings.
- Look for seals and marine birds.

OVERVIEW

Experience the serenity and infinite beauty of Saguenay National Park by hiking one of its most magnificent trails. While the drive to the park is scenic, it pales in comparison to the landscape within the park and Saguenay Fjord, both of which are staggeringly beautiful. Over the past two million years, the Saguenay River has undergone four glacial stages that have carved deep valleys in the area. The forests were logged in the 1800s and 1900s, but the now-protected land has steadily begun to return to its former glory. Seeing the parkland on foot offers a wonderful perspective of this intricate ecosystem. You will hike the breathtaking Point de Vue du Soupir trail, which gains about 450 feet in altitude and will provide incredible views of the forest and river far below. After the hike, you will head back to the pier.

- Hike a particularly picturesque trail within the Saguenay National Park.
- · Pause along the way to drink in the majestic scenery.
- Discover how the forests have rebounded since being logged about 100 years ago.

OVERVIEW

Discover the wonders within Saguenay National Park, enjoy a leisurely stroll along one of the park's easiest trails. After an extraordinarily scenic drive, you will arrive in Saguenay National Park, which encompasses the spectacular Saguenay Fjord, the world's southernmost fjord. Join your guide for an easy one-hour stroll along the Meandres des Falaises trail and discover the Eternity River Delta. During your stroll you will hear about the creation and characteristics of the Saguenay Fjord, whose magnificent topography was sculpted by glaciers 10 million years ago. You will gain the knowledge what makes a fjord and how was it shaped, and why the waters of the Saguenay River are so dark and salty. Learn about the sand dunes (or are they marine terraces?), and which species can be regularly observed in the park. After your guided stroll you could visit the visitor center.





OVERVIEW


Discover how local artisans make cheese, blow glass and weave alpaca wool using time-honored traditional techniques. Your immersion into these crafts will include the family-owned Fromagerie Boivin, where you will see how a variety of cheeses is made and then sample a selection of them. One of the most popular items is a cheese curd that squeaks when you chew it. You will enhance your understanding of glass-blowing at the Touverre Workshop as the craftsmen demonstrate how to manipulate glass into creative shapes. You may also learn about the materials needed to produce glass and the history of glass-blowing. Similarly, at the Alpaga Bersi farm, you will see how craftsmen skillfully weave alpaca wool into sweaters, hats, scarves and other clothing. Unlike sheep's wool, alpaca wool doesn't contain lanolin so it is hypoallergenic.





OVERVIEW

See many of the key attractions that define Saguenay, especially in its decidedly French Chicoutimi district. Saguenay lies at the tip of a majestic fjord where the waters of the Saguenay and the Saint Lawrence rivers meet, and as you drive through the charming town the guide will elaborate on the fjord's importance to trade through the centuries. Upon reaching Chicoutimi, you will pause for photos of the Little White House that survived the devastating floods of 1996. The house is now considered a symbol of perseverance. You will also pass the Ha! Ha! Pyramid, a contemporary art piece that commemorates the destructive flood. The whimsical pyramid is constructed with thousands of Yield Road signs. during this tour you will see a 19th-century pulp mill that helped spur development throughout this part of Canada.

- Gain an understanding of the 1996 flood that caused widespread devastation in Saguenay.
- See a whimsical pyramid-shaped art installation that commemorates the flood

OVERVIEW

Discover the unique qualities of the land and people around Saguenay by visiting several unusual museums devoted to the Saguenay Fjord and pulp mill. Departing from the pier, you will immediately be struck by the natural beauty surrounding Saguenay, which sprawls along the Saguenay River, a tributary of the mighty St. Lawrence. Its fjord, deeply chiseled in the Laurentian Mountains, is one of the world's largest and was discovered by French explorer Jacques Cartier in the mid-1530s. Marine life thrives here, including Beluga whales, Minke whales and Greenland sharks. Arriving at the Fjord Museum, you will discover how the waterway was formed, its importance to the province, and why the museum's strange Ha! Ha! Pyramid monument was created out of more than 3,000 traffic yield signs. Then a self-guided visit will be made, at the historic old paper mill, which is a National Historic Site of Canada, located in a partially forested valley on the Chicoutimi River. The pulp mill once belonged to the Compagnie de Pulp de Chicoutimi, which mechanically transformed wood into paper pulp to meet the demand of European markets at the beginning of the 20th century. Since summer 2002, following major renovations, La Pulperie de Chicoutimi opens its doors to the public and offers artistic and ethnologic displays on the history of the locals' inhabitants. Finally, you'll visit Le Chevrier du Nord, a farm that raises angora goats for mohair clothing. It's quite the enterprise and a memorable end to your tour before driving back to the pier.

- · Visit a goat farm and see how mohair is harvested for a variety of garments.

SAG-010 SAGUENAY HIGHLIGHTS & WINERY DOMAINE CAGEOT

OVERVIEW

Gain a remarkably in-depth historical understanding of the area on a panoramic drive through Saguenay and enjoy a variety of tastings at a winery in the countryside. Saguenay lies along the banks of its namesake river and the Chicoutimi River, where you will see a late-19th-century stone pulp mill that fueled the region's early economy. You will also see evidence of the devastating impact of the rivers while pausing at the Little White House, which survived the floods of 1996 and became a symbol of perseverance. Still, Saguenay's most unusual attraction is the whimsical Ha! Ha! Pyramid, a contemporary art installation made with thousands of Yield Road signs. It commemorates that destructive flood. After traveling into the rolling countryside west of Saguenay, you will visit Domaine le Cageot, the region's first vineyard and producer of spirits. Besides tasting its premier spirits, you will enjoy a slice of blueberry pie, a blueberry tea, a tasting of three wines—including the blueberry aperitif wine Bleu de Roi,

the raspberry and blueberry aperitif wine Frambleu—and a blueberry Kir Royal cocktail, along with a blueberry ganache chocolate.

- View many of Saguenay's most defining landmarks while driving through town.
- Discover how the rivers that flow through Saguenay have influenced its development.
- See a 19th-century pulp mill and a house that miraculously survived the flood of 1996.
- Behold a contemporary outdoor art piece made with road signs that commemorates that flood.
- · Sample house made spirits and foods made with berries at an acclaimed winery Domaine le Cageot.

No wonder bootleggers chose this isolated spot to smuggle their contraband liquor during Prohibition. By the mid-1930s, Baie Comeau began to develop in earnest due to the timber industry as you will discover at the lumberjack village Forestier d'Antan. You will see how those pioneers lived and get an idea of their harsh working conditions through historical exhibits at the village's interpretation center. Back in Baie Comeau, you will enjoy a brief tour of the city's quaint commercial heart by driving along Place LaSalle. This shop-lined artery runs between the fountain in Place de la Biosphere and the statue of Colonel Robert McCormick, the founder of Baie Comeau.

Your tour commences with a scenic drive through the Old Port, a former warehouse district that is now home to quaint restaurants, unique stores, and art galleries. Continuing, you will pass through the New Arts District, the heart of Portland's cultural resurgence, and pause for

photos at Portland Head Light, Maine's oldest lighthouse. You will make another photo stop at the extraordinary Wedding Cake House in Kennebunkport. With its carved buttresses, spires, and lacy spandrels, this 1826 home is one of the most photographed buildings in the state. Just as famous is the George H.W. Bush family summer estate, which you will pass on the way to Dock Square, where you will enjoy free time to shop and dine on your own.

OVFRVIEW

Cruise to Peaks Island for a traditional Maine lobster bake with all sorts of delectable side dishes. A ferry will take you across Casco Bay to the island, which lies just three miles offshore. On the way over, you will pass the 19th-century Bug Light Lighthouse, an elegant cast-iron beacon with Corinthian columns. First settled by the Abnaki Indians, Peaks Island didn't start to flourish until the late 1890s, when Portland's population grew, and an amusement park went up. It is hard to imagine, but Peaks Island was once called the "Coney Island of Maine." Today, the population is about 1,000, and the lifestyle is low-key and quintessentially New England. Upon arriving, you will walk to the nearby Inn on Peaks Island, a seasonal lodging that features outstanding views of the sea and classic Maine cuisine. There, you will enjoy a traditional lobster bake with New England clam chowder, steamed mussels and sides such as corn on the cob.





OVERVIEW

Bicycle along a popular coastal promenade to the state park on forested Mackworth Island, where you will hike along a picturesque loop trail before bicycling back to Portland. Meeting at the pier, you'll receive a safety briefing and helmet and then begin your biking adventure. Riding a bicycle allows you a wonderful up-close view of the area. As you pedal along the tree-lined Eastern Promenade, you can expect to see other bikers, joggers and walkers enjoying this waterfront trail. The promenade was built along a former rail corridor and offers spectacular views of Casco Bay. Every so often, you will pause for the guide to elaborate on the significance of landmarks like Fort Gorges, which perches on uninhabited Hog Island. The fort wasn't finished until the end of the Civil War, by which time weaponry had changed making it obsolete. Later, you will learn fascinating facts about Bug Lighthouse, which was once just a wooden tower, and the Casco Bay Islands, also known as the Calendar Islands, because there are supposedly 365 of them. Upon reaching Mackworth Island, you will hop off your bike for a one-mile hike along a trail that encircles the island. In 1946 Maine's governor set aside the island "as a sanctuary for wild beasts and birds," and in fact, buried his own dogs here. During your hike you may also spot seagulls and ospreys. After leaving Mackworth Island, you will pedal back to the pier.
