## Lysekil, Sweden

### LYS-001 CITY & PARK BIKE TOUR

#### OVERVIEW

Hop on a bicycle for an exhilarating spin through picturesque Lysekil, from its beautifully preserved Old Town to a coastline where nature is well-preserved, too. Established as a fishing village in the 1560s, Lysekil has long been tied to the sea – right down to the two fish that adorn its coat of arms. So it's fitting that your active adventure begins at the pier as you head out along the waterfront. You'll two-wheel into a magnificent stretch of pristine shoreline at Stangehuvud Nature Reserve, where the terrain hasn't changed for eons. Hopping off the bike for a time, you'll take a guided cliff walk across huge granite boulders with smooth surfaces holding small pools in their depressions. A stop for coffee and a light snack provides an energy boost and a chance to hear a bit of Lysekil history and see where Swedish stonemasons once quarried rock along this ancient coastline. Returning to the saddle, you'll pedal back to Lysekil to explore the 200-year-old Old Town – all narrow alleyways, colorful wooden houses, and flat terrain for easy riding. No question: this is a wonderful town to explore, and a bicycle is an ideal mode of transport around it.

#### HIGHLIGHTS

- Tour Lysekil and its surrounds on a bike for a more intimate experience than is possible by coach.
- Cycle along the coast and into an unspoiled nature preserve, with a brief cliff walk along smooth boulders.
- Enjoy a mid-trip break for coffee and a light snack along with a backgrounder on local history.
- Pedal back into town for a two-wheeled survey of Old Town's narrow lanes and colorful houses.

#### OVERVIEW

Sightsee along the dramatic coastline of the Bohuslän archipelago as you travel by small boat to the stylishly rustic fishing village of Smögen. A short walk along the pier brings you to your local boat for a two-hour cruise through one of Sweden's most captivating natural locales: the thousands of scattered Bohuslän islands. During your skirt along the coasts of these craggily beautiful islets you'll likely see sailboats and kayakers carving their way through the sparkling water, seals basking in the sun, and remote fishing villages nestled within natural coves. After a time, tiny Smögen will appear on the watery horizon – a fishing village whose 19th-century wooden boat landings have long been united into a continuous multicolor pier. It's a setting so photogenic this unlikely little hamlet has become an elegant vacation spot. A guided walking tour is in order, after which you'll

have free time to wander at will. Invite temptation at fashionable boutiques along the waterfront or enjoy a quick and fresh seafood snack at one of the local eateries. We hear the prawn sandwiches, salmon cakes and grilled halibut are all winners. Rather than cruise back to Lysekil, you'll return by coach along equally picturesque coastal roads.

#### OVERVIEW

One of the most attractive locales you could find in an archipelago known for its beauty, Fiskebäckskil is beloved for its colorful old wooden houses sporting intricately carved porches. The village church dates from 1772 and has a surprising opulent feel for such an out-of-the-way settlement. This town was also home to one of Sweden's most respected artists, Carl Wilhelmson, whose powerful portraits and landscapes hang in the National Museum. You'll see his house and other landmarks on your guided town walk, then have the opportunity to wander freely a while, discovering even more of Fiskebäckskil's charms. The town restaurants may offer the strongest temptations in the form of fresh local herring, cod and shrimp. Whatever they may be, pursue your favorite pleasures before boarding the return ferry, perhaps with a new favorite place added to your travel log.

OVERVIEW

Settle in for a wonderfully panoramic drive through Denmark's second-largest city with enlightening stops at two of its most historical landmarks. You will appreciate the diversity of Aarhus when passing attractions such as the Botanical Garden, ARoS Art Museum and the city hall that visionary architects Arne Jacobsen and Erik Møller designed. As much as Aarhus has evolved over the years, it still celebrates its past in buildings such as the cathedral, whose construction began in the 12th century. It is the longest and tallest church in Denmark, but its significance goes far beyond size. Be sure to note its exquisite frescoes and unusual baptismal font featuring the four Evangelists with symbolic animal heads. The dozens of buildings that make up the open-air museum Den Gamle By will show you how Danish life has changed from the 15th century through the 1970s. To add authenticity, the staff wear costumes and act like villagers did during those time periods.

OVERVIEW

Discover the considerable charms of the Old Town district of Ebeltøft, an urban experience that a picturesque drive through Mols Bjerge National Park will complement perfectly. The narrow cobblestone streets and traditional half-timbered houses lend a rare and delightful ambiance to Ebeltøft, which was founded in 1301. As you walk through this historical part of town, the guide will point out the most intriguing attractions, such as the steam-driven, screw-powered warship Jylland, now a museum

anchored in the old port. Free time will also be allotted to further explore Ebeltøft, whether you prefer to follow the guide's suggestions or just browse on your own. There is plenty to see either way. The sights will be just as spectacular, but quite different, in the national park on the outskirts of town. The last Ice Age left its mark on the topography, which woodlands, open meadows and heaths now cover. More than half the wild flora in Denmark flourishes there.

OVERVIEW

See Aarhus in air-conditioned comfort and with the greatest of ease on a panoramic drive that will present the city's most compelling highlights. Once you settle in, you will pass landmark attractions such as Aarhus University, the second-oldest and second-largest in the country. How fitting for the second-largest city in Denmark. City hall stands out as it was finished in 1941 during the German occupation of Aarhus, when much of Europe was being destroyed. While driving past the open-air museum Den Gamle By, you will gain further architectural insight, as its dozens of buildings were constructed centuries ago. The circular rainbow-colored walkway that you will spot atop the ARoS museum is a modern art installation that offers sweeping views of the surrounding urban landscape. If the Danish royal family isn't in attendance, you will stop for photos at Marselisborg Palace, their summer residence. It was built in 1902 as a wedding gift for the then prince and princess.

**AAR-004 HISTORIC AARHUS WALKING TOUR**

**OVERVIEW**  
Walk through the districts closest to the pier and come away with an understanding of how Aarhus evolved to become the second-largest city in Denmark. Vikings first settled the area, but the oldest buildings in Aarhus are from medieval times, the most prominent being the 13th-century cathedral. Expect to be taken by its size, as the enormous red-brick building is Denmark's longest and tallest church. The nearby Latin Quarter was built on the site of the earliest Viking fortifications and is considered Aarhus' oldest district. Its Church of our Lady contains a crypt from the 11th century. The second half of the walk will focus more on eclectic attractions such as the quaint lane Møllestien, the Arne Jacobsen-designed city hall and ARoS, the most-visited art museum in Scandinavia. You can't miss the circular walkway with rainbow-colored glass walls on its roof. You will enjoy a panoramic view of Aarhus from the terrace atop the Salling department store.

  - See Denmark's longest and tallest church and Scandinavia's most-visited art museum.

**OVERVIEW**  
Delve into Danish history by exploring a private castle that has been in the Rosenkrantz family since the mid-16th century and a manor home that's even older. Rosenholm Castle rises from an island in the middle of a lake, a location that offered natural protection over the centuries. Once inside, you will behold an elaborate interior beautifully furnished in the Rococo style. Tapestries embellish many of the rooms, all of which are decorated with period furniture. Still, the most striking piece is the portrait in the Great Hall of Frederik V, known as the Winter King. It is the work of C.G. Pilo, the official painter to the Danish Royal Court in the 18th century. Not far off, you will find the Renaissance estate Gammel Estrup Manor, which has been a museum for nearly 100 years. Completed in 1460, it presents a window into the lives of Denmark's nobility and their servants.

**OVERVIEW**  
Gain an understanding of Viking life during the 10th-century reign of Danish king Harald Bluetooth by visiting an ancient fortress and farmstead. Situated on a protected inlet near Viking trading routes, Fyrkat fortress features a classic ring design with four entrances around a circle. Decades of excavations have unearthed walkways, foundations and burial grounds that reveal how the site was used in peace time and when under attack. The replica of a longhouse built outside the earthworks fortress lends a different perspective of Viking life. Similarly, the Viking farmstead nearby depicts the agricultural lifestyle in the Middle Ages. It is an accurate reconstruction of a Viking farm in Jelling, Bluetooth's hometown. While meandering about, you can observe the costumed staff performing various household chores and cultural activities. You may have the opportunity to sample typical foods that the Vikings ate, such as herring, berries, fruit and porridge.

- Visit a Viking ring fortress that excavations estimate was constructed in the 10th century.
  - Get a glimpse into everyday Viking life at a replica farm from that time period.

interior is bathed in natural light and brightly illuminated to show off the international art. As you meander about, you will be struck by the power of landmark works such as “Boy,” a massive, almost uncomfortably realistic glass-fiber sculpture. Similarly, you can’t miss the monumental textile installation that hangs from the ceiling and stretches over 160 feet. It is a collaborative work that 50 full-time artists created. Also, be sure to see “9 Spaces,” another piece of installation art whose title refers to the nine circles of hell described in Dante’s classic “Inferno.”

KIE-001 OS-HAMBURG & NEUENGAMME

OVERVIEW

Enjoy an enlightening drive through Hamburg and, as a contrast, a sobering visit to the notorious Neuengamme Concentration Camp. During World War II, more than 100,000 people endured horrific conditions at the camp while being forced to work in its brickworks. You will view the factory, the deplorable prison housing, buildings that the SS used and the House of Remembrance, where the names of the prisoners that died are written on white fabric banners. It will be a moving experience and a revealing look into the Nazi mindset. Although much of Hamburg was destroyed in the war, it was beautifully rebuilt, as you will discover by passing landmarks such as Germany’s oldest stock exchange, the opulent 647-room town hall and the Gothic-style warehouse district Speicherstadt. You will also see the exquisite Jungfernstieg shopping promenade, the enormous Baroque church St. Michaelis and the Reeperbahn entertainment district, where the Beatles played long before they became famous.

- Get a poignant glimpse into the horrors of World War II at a former concentration camp.
- View the prisoners’ housing and the brickworks where they forced to work.
- Gain an excellent overall understanding of Hamburg on an introductory driving tour.

OVERVIEW

Delve into the extraordinary maritime history of Kiel by visiting its namesake canal and a memorial dedicated to those who died in the World Wars. The canal opened in 1895 and is now the world’s busiest artificial waterway. It connects the North Sea to the Baltic Sea, where you will pause for photos of the Holtenau Locks at the northeastern terminus. It will be fascinating to see how the locks operate and how the canal has been altered over the past century to accommodate more ships. **OVERVIEW**  
Delve into Lithuania's rugged natural beauty and discover a former nuclear missile bunker that once threatened all of Europe. From the pier, you'll drive to Zemaitija National Park, deep within sparsely populated Plokstine Forest. Passing magnificent vistas and a crystalline lake, you'll soon see that this green and remote place was also once home to a lethal secret. Plokstine Missile Base is a stark reminder of the Cold War, its four silos excavated by hand in an-around-the clock effort by thousands of soldiers, conducted across 3 years in total secrecy. Becoming operational in 1963, the R12 Dvina nuclear missiles here were targeted at Europe's largest cities, including Berlin, London, Madrid and Paris. In 1962, similar missiles deployed from here to Havana precipitated the Cuban Missile Crisis. Luckily, none were ever fired and Plokstine's were all removed when the site closed in 1979. Abandoned after the Soviet Union's collapse, the silos and central control complex were reopened as a Cold War Museum in 2012. During your guided tour of the corridors, mineshaft and deep underground tunnels of this once-hot launch site you'll even have a chance to climb through a narrow hatch to check out one of the silos.

**HIGHLIGHTS**

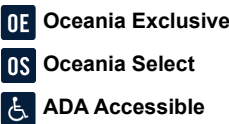
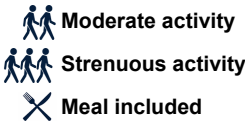
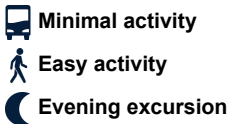

From the pier, you'll travel past top Klaipeda landmarks like the Clock and Watch Museum, the Gothic Revival post office and a former barracks that now houses Klaipeda University. Lithuania remained under Soviet rule from the end of World War II until it regained independence in 1991. You'll drive through several Soviet-built residential areas. The scenery and your guide's commentary will provide great insight into this long chapter in Lithuania's history. But as influential as that era was, the production of items made from amber has had an even longer – and certainly more positive – impact on Klaipeda. Since ancient times, this fossilized resin from prehistoric pine trees has been used in medicines, perfume and jewelry. It's even found in colors other than amber – including yellow and sometimes red. You'll watch amber artisans creating one-of-a-kind jewelry, see amber antiques, and sip a cup of herbal tea while hearing tales of the ancient amber trade route that passed near Old Town.

Adding a more uplifting note, enjoy light refreshments in the museum's beautiful winter garden, surrounded by exotic plants.
