As a result, many of the plants found there are carnivorous and feed on insects that they trap. The sundews and pitcher plants are particularly interesting.

The guide will elaborate on the bog's unique biodiversity of the flora and fauna as you walk the raised duckboard path. Keep an eye out for birds such as ospreys, cranes and whimbrels. Typically seen in huge flocks, whimbrels are supposedly named for the sound of their call. It is likely that you will also spot butterflies and moths. The yellowish-purple Idaea muricata moth was chosen as Valkmusa's symbol because it is only found in coastal areas in southern Finland.

These so-called "bomb houses" of red and yellow brick were built after World War II, replacing the one-in-ten of all Ronne homes that were leveled by intensive Red Army aerial bombardment at the close of the war.
