OVERVIEW

Discover the beauty of the countryside outside Sydney as you head for the World Heritage splendor of the Blue Mountains. Headed west from the city, feel the echoes of excitement still reverberating as you pass the site of the 2000 Sydney Olympics at Homebush. Travel through small towns and bushlands that Sydneysiders escape to on weekends as you begin to climb into the Blues along a road once the trail of Australia's early explorers. Drink in panoramic views of an awe-inspiring Grand Canyon of giant rock formations and cascading waterfalls. Once up at the Blue

Mountains lookout, spot the famous Three Sisters rock formation and bask in the breathtaking views all around you – of Jamieson Valley, Mount Solitary, Ruined Castle, Katoomba Falls and the Burragorang Valley. A brief walk at the bottom brings you to where the ScenicScender cable car picks up for your return to the mountaintop. SYD-007 BRIDGE CLIMB & THE ROCKS

OVERVIEW

Here's your chance to experience a once-in-a-lifetime thrill as you embark on a safe but scary climb up to the summit of the Sydney Harbour Bridge. Don't worry, organized climbs have been ascending the span for years now. Your local escort will walk you to BridgeClimb HQ, where you'll be given an extensive safety briefing, issued a special BridgeSuit to wear over your clothing, and outfitted with an all-important safety harness. Proceeding to the Climb simulator, your experienced Climb Leader will ensure that you're up to speed on ladder procedures and harness use. Then, set up with radio and headset for hearing your leader's commentary, it's time to get out there! During approximately two hours on the bridge, your group of 12 climbers will make its way over 4,900 feet of steel, weaving through catwalks and up ladders – all to reach the most spectacular part of all, the upper arch climb. As birds-eye views of Sydney Harbour and the city fully surround you, your Climb Leader will capture the "historic" moment on camera.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Gather your courage for a never-to-be-forgotten adventure as you literally climb one of the world's most iconic bridges.
- With your Climb Leader's briefing under your belt, a spiffy BridgeSuit over your clothes, and your safety harness ready to click in when instructed, begin your ascent.
- Spend two adrenaline-laced hours crossing catwalks, climbing ladders, and making your way to the upper arch and back.

HELPFUL HINTS

- Wear comfortable clothing; a ClimbSuit must be worn over it during the climb.
- Flat, rubber-soled athletic shoes with a closed toe are mandatory.
- Bring a hat, sunglasses and sunscreen as needed.

PLEASE NOTE

This tour is not available to wheelchair guests, pregnant women, or those with mobility concerns, heart problems, asthma, epilepsy, or recent back/neck injuries. It is also not recommended for those with a fear of heights. Guests must be physically fit and able to climb ladders and steep slopes. The actual bridge climb lasts some 2 hours and traverses nearly 5,000 feet of steps, catwalks, arches and ladders. The walk to and from The Rocks involves some uneven and cobblestone surfaces. No one under the influence of alcohol or drugs may participate. A breathalyzer test will be performed to each participant before the climb. A release form must be signed before taking part in the tour. Due to the nature of the climb, nothing may be carried with you onto the bridge; however, photo opportunities will be available during The Rocks walk. The Bridge Climb also required climbers aged 75 years or older to have a completed Certificate of Fitness signed by a Doctor. Anyone ages 75 years or older that does not have this certificate completed and signed will not be permitted to climb.

OVERVIEW

Later, an amble through the Botanic Gardens introduces you to exotic Aussie flora like chocolate pudding trees, jackfruit, blue ginger and the Cooktown Orchid, state emblem of Queensland.

- Enjoy a guided overview of Australia's first non-indigenous settlement, founded temporarily and by accident by Captain James Cook.
- Drive through town and up to the top of Grassy Hill, where Cook saw much the same views you will.

- Take a relaxed stroll through tropical botanic gardens established in 1878 and see colorful, curious plants long-used for food and medicine by local aboriginal peoples.

Settle back for a cruise along a serene, mangrove-lined river little changed from when pioneering explorer Captain James Cook named it in 1770. Departing the pier aboard a vessel optimized for sightseeing, you'll venture into a landscape rich in indigenous wildlife and natural beauty – as it was when Cook beached his HMS Endeavour along this watercourse to make emergency repairs after an unplanned encounter with the Great Barrier Reef just offshore. The Endeavour River banks are still clad in mangroves backed by a seemingly impenetrable rainforest beyond. You can still expect to see large crocodiles sunning in the shallows, and sea eagles flying overhead or perched in the overhanging branches. The brilliant flashes of color you may see flitting about the forest are lorikeets, sunbirds and orioles, and long-legged Jabiru or black-necked storks are commonly spotted wading at the river's edge. Even though Captain Cook and his crew only spent 48 days here before sailing on, Cooktown earned the distinction of being the first non-indigenous settlement in Australia. As you

cruise the river and harbor, you'll learn more about the area, including its history of pearling and the rapid wealth that came after gold was discovered nearby in 1872.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Cruise Cooktown harbor and the Endeavour River aboard a vessel designed for comfortable touring.
- Learn about Captain Cook's time spent along these same waters in 1770 and the unique designation this remote town holds in the history of Australia.

Enjoy a journey through Darwin and its history, visiting sites that chronicle a rich, multicultural past. This cosmopolitan, relaxed capital of the Northern Territory has ties not just to Australia but to the Asian nations just across the Timor Sea to its north – many of which have imparted their flavor to the melting pot here. You'll see this laid out in artistic terms on a visit to the Museum and Art Gallery of the Northern Territory – its collection brimming with Aboriginal, Southeast Asian and Oceanic artworks as well as modern Australian fine art. The sizable Indigenous artifacts gallery reveals much about the peoples who were living in the area long before the HMS Beagle called in 1839 and left behind the name Darwin. Another gallery presents a realistic recreation of what happened when Cyclone Tracy came to call on Darwin on Christmas Eve, 1974. Visiting the Fannie Bay Gaol Museum, you'll see a cruder side of Darwin's heritage. Active from 1883 through 1979, this prison – complete with chilling old gallows section – kept the local peace with a harsh hand. A drive with photo stops at the botanic gardens and scenic East Point rounds out this well-rounded city survey.

- Visit Fannie Bay Gaol Museum, housed in Darwin's original – and not inviting – penal institution.

DRW-006 DARWIN'S MILITARY PAST

OVERVIEW

You don't need to be a buff to be blown away by this tour of sights showcasing Darwin's wartime heritage. This tropical city on the Timor Sea played a pivotal role in the battle against the Japanese during World War II, as Northern Territory airfields were used to carry out bombing and anti-intruder sorties. But war always has its cost, and these provocations of the enemy made Darwin a constant target for retaliatory bombings. Some 64 air raids rained down on Darwin over a two-year period, resulting in many lost Australian lives and 12 sunken ships in the harbor. You can see actual film footage of the bombings along with many other wartime artifacts during your visit to East Point Military Museum, out on a scenic spit of land at the harbor entrance. Heading further inland, you'll tour the sprawling aircraft collection at the Australian Aviation Heritage Centre. The showstopper here is a massive B-52 bomber on permanent loan from the U.S., but also on display are a B-25 Mitchell, Mirage and Sabre jet fighters, a US Army Huey Cobra with rocket pods and Gatling gun, a Mark VIII Spitfire replica and the fascinating wreckage of a Japanese Mitsubishi Zero.

- Travel by coach to East Point for panoramic photos of Darwin Harbor, twice the size of Sydney's.
- Tour the East Point Military Museum, filled with photos and artifacts from Darwin's wartime history.

Leaving Mengwi behind, you'll continue on to Bali's most photographed temple, Tanah Lot. Also referred to as the Sunset Temple, the impressive black lava towers of this sacred 16th century temple are dramatically situated on a rocky outcrop that extends 656 feet offshore. Surrounded by pristine aqua waters and the white surf that crashes against the rocks, it's easy to see why this location has become a favorite with photographers.

This tour provides an excellent introduction to Bali's essential sights as well as its religion, art and culture. Bali's population is approximately 3.5 million, of which 85% are Hindus and the remaining 15% are either Moslems or Christians. The island's rich art and culture have been traditionally passed down from generation to generation by means of the

local community centers and this excursion takes you to several of these key communities where you can see first-hand how Bali's past is infused with the present day. Your tour first travels to at the village of Bona, which specializes in bamboo furniture products. You'll have the opportunity to view the various types of furniture produced here. From Bona, it's on to Kemenuh village, a major woodcarving center. Renowned for its wood-carving, you will be able to watch the local craftsmen as they turn slabs of teak or ebony wood into intricate statues and masks. Of special interest here are the huge carved statues that depict mythical figures, such as the Garuda. Another interesting stop on this tour is at Peliatan village, a village noted for its painters. Traditional Balinese painting was strictly limited to three basic kinds. Most of the paintings were narratives with mythological themes, illustrating stories from Hindu epics and literature. Under the influence of western painters who settled in Bali in the 1930s, Balinese artists began painting single scenes instead of narrative tales, using images from everyday life as their theme. Your visit to Peliatan includes time at one of the local galleries where you can view the beautiful works created by gifted Balinese artists. Continuing on, you'll make your way to Celuk village, a center of gold and silver work where over half the village's population is involved in the silver industry. Original designs in delicate filigree make Balinese jewelry one of the most remarkable styles in Asia. As with most Balinese crafts, gold and silver work is largely a hereditary trade with apprentices beginning to train at a young age and by the time they reach the age of 12, already producing fine ornaments. As your tour draws to a close, you'll make a final stop at Tohpati village, well-known for processing exceptional Batik cloth. Here, you'll have a unique opportunity to observe skilled artisans at work as they use the different methods of applying the colors and printing to the fabric.

- Visit a variety of villages, each known for specializing in a traditional craft.
- Watch artisans produce batik cloth, intricate jewelry and wooden carvings.
- Browse art galleries with paintings that creatively express traditional themes.
