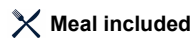
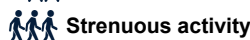
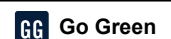

The waters that flow from natural springs within another riverside landmark you'll visit, vast Gutman's Cave, have endurance properties of their own – drinking them is said to be life-prolonging. And a sculpture park nearby keeps Latvian folklore alive and well.

Visits to the New Ghetto Museum and Old Town's magnificent Art Nouveau synagogue, a rare war survivor, end the tour on a more uplifting note.
