OVERVIEW

Explore picturesque fjords, islands, inlets and fishing villages both by coach and on foot during this tour of Sweden's sunny west coast. First up as you motor northward from Gothenburg is tranquil Kungälv, a historical town in the foreground of the ruins of 700-year-old Bohus Fortress, invaded 14 times but never successfully. Further up the coast, the lovely offshore islands of Tjörn and Orust are connected to the mainland by impressive bridges – the longest passes over the Askerö Fjord and offers truly spectacular views of the clustered islands around it. Driving on through Tjörn's rural landscape, you'll arrive at the charming cottage-covered fishing village of Klädesholmen, population circa 385. Here the tour shifts gears as you head out on foot for a brief walk that will introduce you to Klädesholmen's history, closely linked to herring fishing. Back on the coach, you'll head for the larger – but still quaintly small – yachting village of Skärhamn where you can take some time to explore at your leisure then relax on the pleasant return drive to Gothenburg pier.

OVERVIEW
Embark on an excursion across scenic Swedish countryside, passing unique glacial formations enroute to an Elizabethan-styled manor house overlooking the sea. Your coach voyage begins with a drive to Fjärås Bräcka. This barely-pronounceable, 25-mile-long ridge along Lake Lygnern was formed when inland ice receded some 13,000 years ago, leaving behind one of the most remarkable glacial sea formations in the country. After taking in panoramic views here, you’ll continue south from Gothenburg to the peninsula where beautiful Tjolöholm awaits your visit. This fascinating manor house looks like something straight out of 16th-century England yet was built at the turn of the 20th century. The façade is pure Tudor, while the interior is a brilliant example of Art Nouveau design and William Morris craftsmanship. As you tour, you’ll learn how this state-of-the-art estate had many comforts far beyond the standards of the day. It was heated by piped hot air, had its own electric generator, and the bathrooms were fitted with showers and sunken baths. The wall-to-wall carpets were kept clean thanks to a horse-drawn vacuum cleaner pulled around outside the house, its thick hoses passed inside through the windows.

- Travel into the countryside south of Gothenburg, stopping to see unique glacial terrain at Fjärås Bräcka.

- Take an inside tour of Tjolöholm Manor, one of the most curious great houses in all of Sweden.
- Admire the castle’s Tudor-era exterior, then be amazed by its far more modern Arts & Crafts interior.
- Learn about this period home’s high-tech household comforts – including wall-to-wall carpet kept fluffy by a horse-drawn vacuum cleaner.
- Take some free time after the house tour to enjoy the estate’s sea-facing gardens and grounds.

OVERVIEW
Treat your senses to historic sites and exceptional flavors during this driving tour of Gothenburg featuring Kajutan restaurant located in the historical Market Hall. Founded as a small fortified outpost in 1621 by King Gustav II, who wanted to secure Sweden’s only western port against frequent Danish raids, Gothenburg soon grew into a trading and maritime powerhouse. Your city expedition includes fabulous views out to the coastal archipelago from high Alvsborg Bridge and a visit to hilltop Masthuggs Church, along with a brief walk in lovely, park-like Gothenburg Botanical Gardens. A stop at Götaplatsen square brings the Museum of Fine Arts, Concert Hall and magnificent 23-foot Poseidon Fountain sculpture into view, while bustling Avenyn leads to Gustav Adolfs Torg, the town square anchored by city hall, the courthouse and the bourse. Following a must-see stop at Gothenburg’s legendary Feskekôrka Market – that means “Fish Church” in Swedish which is currently under renovation at the moment and not much can be seen. Next, you’ll head for your lunch date at Kajutan, located in Saluhallen (the old food market hall) in central Gothenburg. The building dates back to 1888 and is the most famous “food hub” in the city offering the very best products. In 1985, the building was registered as State building monument due to its important historical value. During lunch you will be able to enjoy the atmosphere from above while enjoying your four - course seafood lunch.

- Survey the streets, bridges and squares and landmarks of Gothenburg from a panoramic coach.

OVERVIEW

This high-adventure tour delivers the thrill of crewing a racing sailboat through Gothenburg's picturesque offshore archipelago. You'll leave the pier headed for Långedrag Marina on your racing yacht. On boarding, you'll receive safety and instructions from the skipper and his sail racing team/crew before commencing on this exhilarating 4-hour experience. The Gothenburg archipelago consists of some 3,000 islands – from large and densely inhabited to tiny islets just one or two shacks. The island collection is split into two parts, north and south, and stretches from Rörö in the north to Vrångö in the south. Renowned for their natural beauty and charming houses created with careful environmental sensitivity, many of the islands are nature reserves with distinctive flora and fauna, lovely sandy beaches and soft dune-like cliffs. As your voyage unfolds, you will have opportunities to hoist the sail and sheet home, grind a winch, trim a jib, punch a stopwatch, or just kick back and relax. A light lunch will be served on board. At the sail's conclusion, you'll sail back to the cruise pier.

HIGHLIGHTS

- For a few delirious hours, become crew on a racing yacht dancing between the islands off Gothenburg.
- Haul sails, trim jibs, winch sheets and otherwise participate – or just sit back and revel in the scenery.
- Lose count of the islets you've seen as you tack through huge clusters of them – some large, many tiny, all beautiful.
- Enjoy a light lunch and refreshments on board.

OVERVIEW

Discover why Sweden's west coast is renowned for its abundance of seafood during this relaxed fishing excursion. After a brief transfer to a

Gothenburg marina, you'll board a comfortable and fully-equipped fishing boat, headed for the teeming waters of the Kattegatt Sea. You'll skim past Ekeskären, well-known for its seal colony – listen for them barking in Swedish – as you cruise out to the mackerel fishing holes off rocky Vinga, a lighthouse island at the far western reach of Gothenburg famous archipelago. A popular delicacy in Sweden, the mackerel found in vast shoals out here grows to 1.5 feet in length. The region is also rich in other prized marine life like cod, lobster, catfish and prawns. Your scenic angling expedition will be broken up into two sessions, with a break taken to refuel the boat and yourself on Vinga. After a light lunch and some time to take in the natural beauty of the island, you'll reboard the boat and return to the water to find all the fish you missed during the first half. They're out there.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Board a well-equipped fishing boat and head for the mackerel-rich waters of the Kattegatt Sea.
- See a seal colony off Ekeskären as you make for the known fishing holes off Vinga Island.
- Fish for two sessions, broken up by a refueling and lunch stop on the remote lighthouse island.

- Wear warm, layered clothing; include a windbreaker.
- Rubber-sole or deck shoes must be worn on the boat.

You get a glimpse of the so-called Barcode-area, the latest addition of office buildings, as well as the new library and many apartment houses in the area of Bjørvika. Passing through the inner-city tunnel you will further on see the Royal Palace, built in the first half of the last century and the residence of the Royal Family. Drive by Vigeland Sculpture Park before beginning the climb up Holmenkollen Hill, sight of the former world-famous ski jumping arena. On clear days the view over the town and the Oslofjord is simply amazing. Leaving Holmenkollen you will pass through residential areas back to the fjord and to the peninsula of Bygdøy, home of many well-known museums. After a photo stop along the fjord, your tour will conclude with a scenic drive up the Hill of Ekeberg for a fantastic view of the harbor, the fjord with its many islands and a large part of the town that stretches out in the valley below you. A scenic drive along the shoreline brings you back to the pier.

Continue to the Kon-Tiki Museum, home to the original balsa-wood raft used by Thor Heyerdahl and his five companions on their 1947 voyage from Peru to Polynesia, crossing 1,864 miles of open ocean. The museum

also displays the papyrus boat Ra II, used by Heyerdahl to successfully cross the Atlantic Ocean in 1970, along with a selection of documentary material. You will also visit the Fram Museum, dedicated to the famous polar exploration vessel Fram, built by Colin Archer in 1892. The ship was used on Arctic and Antarctic expeditions, including Roald Amundsen's successful South Pole expedition of 1910–1911. From Bygdøy, drive along the harbor lined with pleasure boats and enjoy views of the charming Oscarshall Castle, the summer residence of King Oscar I of Sweden and Norway on the way back to the ship.

After spending two hours or so in the embrace of the spa’s waters, you’ll completely understand what brought them here.

- Spend about two hours in steamy luxury as you bathe in an open-air pool of mineral-rich water heated by the earth’s core.

While mentioned in the earliest of Icelandic sagas, this miniscule outpost’s big claim to fame came late in the 19th century when the locals’ exceptional prowess at chess captured the outside world’s attention. Go figure.

The soup’s ingredients change daily depending on the fresh catch.
