OVERVIEW

Enjoy a leisurely two-wheeled spin that brings you past intriguing Skagen landmarks like a sand-buried church, artists' hideaways and a Danish royal family mansion. You'll be pedaling into an environment famed for its natural beauty and magnificent light, drawing painters here like moths to a flame. This long-thriving art colony also caught the eye of the Danish royal family, who built Klitgarden here in 1914 as their summer residence. No longer royal, this sizable and plush beachfront shack now known as the Dune House is a retreat where painters, authors and imaginative scientists can share ideas and revel in the luminosity of it all. You'll also coast by the former homes of other beloved artists and poets, including the one who first put Skagen on the art colony map back in the 1870s. Even back then, the Buried Church you'll see at Grenen was already under the sand. Built long before almost anything else here, it sits under a giant migrating dune – with nothing but its tower left visible above the shifting sands. One final curiosity you'll encounter is Vippefyret, a bascule lantern that raises a flaming basket high aloft as a navigational aid. It's a 17th-century thing.

In contrast to Lonstrup's bohemian vibe, pious austerity reigns at 11th-century Boerglum Abbey, now a private 85-room estate after centuries spent as a royal residence, monastery and manor house. It remains an amazing setting, as you will soon discover when browsing the welcome center, church, kitchen and stables.

Get your fill of wild phenomena as you watch majestic Scandinavian birds of prey demonstrate their awesome abilities and visit the largest moving sand dune in Northern Europe. You will view the factory, the deplorable prison housing, buildings that the SS used and the House of Remembrance, where the names of the prisoners that died are written on white fabric banners. It will be a moving experience and a revealing look into the Nazi mindset. Although much of Hamburg was destroyed in the war, it was beautifully rebuilt, as you will discover by passing landmarks such as Germany's oldest stock exchange, the opulent 647-room town hall and the Gothic-style warehouse district Speicherstadt. You will also see the exquisite Jungfernstieg shopping promenade, the enormous Baroque church St. Michaelis and the Reeperbahn entertainment district, where the Beatles played long before they became famous.

Huge city parks with open public access are also a big thing in Stockholm, as you'll see during your spin through another island, verdant Djurgården, once the exclusive hunting grounds of Swedish sovereigns.

Begun in 1662, the palace's construction outlasted its designer and was completed by his son. Your return to the city includes a memorable photo stop at Fjällgatan viewpoint, where Stockholm arrays itself before you in its own regal style.

The last leg of your Nobel pilgrimage brings you past Heleneborg, where Alfred Nobel once lived and conducted his nitroglycerine experiments – including the one that accidentally killed his younger brother, Emil.

It needed to be lengthy – this is where ship-sized nautical ropes were made; you'll see how in an enlightening demonstration. Continuing your city survey by panoramic coach, you'll spin through a historical neighborhood where dockworkers have always lived. In the city center, you'll enjoy a guided walk that showcases Karlskrona's baroque skyline, and have some free time to explore further on your own.

- Tour Karlskrona's Old Naval Shipyard, whose collection of plus-sized naval landmarks includes the longest wooden building in Sweden – built over 300 years ago.

Other museum highlights include a collection of wooden figureheads from Sweden's most illustrious warships, sunken shipwrecks you can view from an underwater tunnel, and an exhibit exploring navigation before the compasses and GPS. Ancient shipbuilding tools, a medieval sea atlas and actual historic vessels out on the quay add to the wonder here.

Cross the picturesque countryside of southeastern Sweden to visit the country's first Renaissance town, founded in 1603. Your panoramic coach drive from Karlskrona winds along the coast, stopping for photos in places like tranquil little Torhamn as you work your way up to Kristianopel, a city that was being regularly attacked and burned by Danes a century before Karlskrona was even founded. Eventually, this early Renaissance town was rebuilt in a style that featured broad streets intersecting at right angles, allowing its defenders to quickly reach the protective town walls. Once peace finally reigned between Sweden and Denmark, Kristianopel lost its strategic importance and slowly faded into historical obscurity. On your brief escorted walk through town, you'll see remnants of those ancient walls as well as a charming church the Danes put up in 1624 when they still controlled this part of Sweden. You'll also have about an hour to explore quaint Kristianopel at your leisure, perhaps deciding to indulge in some southern Swedish cuisine. Leave room for dessert, the berry-filled pastries here are a treat. So is the scenery on the trip back – which includes a photo stop at Bryggareberget.
