

LDR-002 DELIGHTFUL DERRY & IRISH COFFEE

This leisurely spin through Derry passes top landmarks, visits the Tower Museum and finishes with music and Irish coffee. Driving from the pier along the Foyle River, you can't miss Old Town: it's surrounded by monumental 26-foot ramparts and gates. Never breached since they went up in the early 1600s, these fortified walls are among the best-preserved in Europe. Across the river, Iskaheen View provides sweeping panoramas of the entire city, the bay and the hills of Donegal in the distance. During your city survey, you'll see the historic and cultural sights like an old workhouse for the poor, a former British army barracks and the powerful political street murals painted by loyalists protesting British policies. You'll also get a glimpse of the shipyards where so many left Ireland during the Great Famine. Londonderry's own turbulent history comes fully to life as you tour the Tower Museum, with its exhibits covering everything from the city's founding through 1972's infamous Bloody Sunday, when British troops fired on civil rights protesters as they marched through Bogside. For a calmer perspective of the local culture, a visit to Guildhall, for an Irish coffee and traditional music fits the bill. Guildhall, originally built in 1887 by The Honourable The Irish Society. The red sandstone building is of neo-gothic architecture, with Tudor overtones.

- Traveling mostly by coach, get an overview of historic and cultural landmarks throughout Londonderry.
- Admire towering Old City walls considered some of the best-preserved in Europe.
- Tour the Tower Museum and see exhibits reflecting Derry's dramatic history and political struggles.

Discover the events that have shaped Londonderry on a tour that walks its 17th-century fortified walls, visits its civil rights museum and toasts its future at a wine reception. Your perspective ranges from high Iskaheen View, with its sweeping panoramas of Derry, the bay and the hills of Donegal, to up-close encounters with political wall murals commemorating the period known as The Troubles. This 1960s and 1970s era of Irish civil rights struggle is well-explained by exhibits you'll see at the Museum of Free Derry, while monuments seen in the Bogside neighborhood shed even more light on key events like the Hunger Strikes. The scenery as you travel the city is always interesting, from a picturesque drive along the Foyle River to a historic workhouse for the poor, a former British army barracks, and the old shipyards where so many left Ireland during the 19th-century Great Famine. From a walk along the top of 26-foot-high Old City walls, you'll get a clear sense of Derry's medieval street plan – and at the landmark Guildhall, a late-Gothic stunner, you'll admire stonework and stained glass as you enjoy a casual wine reception before returning to the ship.

Even the drive there from Derry is a scenic feast, across County Donegal and into the heart of the beautiful, sparsely populated Derryveagh Mountain region. As you enter the park, you might even catch sight of a herd of red deer, free-ranged here as they once did throughout Ireland. Celebrities once free-ranged on this estate too, as you'll learn during your guided visit to Glenveagh Castle. This magnificent turreted mansion went up in 1873, built by a wealthy Irish landowner intent on eclipsing even famous Balmoral Castle's grandeur. He certainly came close. In its later years as a private residence, Glenveagh hosted many glamorous guests, including Greta Garbo and Marilyn Monroe. At the end of your inside tour, you'll have about an hour of free time to stroll the castle's expansive gardens, which still retain their original Victorian layout protected by windbreaks of fragrant pines and rhododendrons. Don't miss the Gothic Orangery.

- Travel to Glenveagh National Park by coach, crossing through picture-postcard Donegal countryside.
- Savor the scenery of this unspoiled wonderland of glens, mountains, lakes and free-roaming red deer.
- Tour the inside of Glenveagh Castle, a sprawling 19th century mansion built with the intention of outdoing even famous Balmoral Castle.
- Learn the story of its somewhat unsavory original owner, and of the A-listers who've slept here since.
- Spend some time wandering the castle's wonderful Victorian gardens, little changed since those times.
- Wear layered, weather-appropriate clothing; include a light raincoat or umbrella.
- Flat, comfortable walking shoes are recommended.
- Bring a hat, sunglasses and sunscreen as needed.

Walk atop the Old City's famous 17th-century walls, listen in at Saint Columb's Cathedral and lift a pint at a pub. Whether you call it Londonderry or just Derry – the correct name, like most things here in Northern Ireland, being a subject of much debate – this town is a noted time capsule. Its mile of surrounding walls has never once been breached since 1618, and a guided walk along their 26-foot-high summit gives you a mapmaker's vantage point on Derry's still-visible medieval street plan. You'll also have a great view of the Guildhall, a Gothic stunner sitting just outside the walls – with a clock tower that would give Big Ben a serious run for his money. At Saint Columb's Cathedral, you'll hear the organist rock the ancient stone walls with a rendition of that Irish favorite "Londonderry Air" – known more widely as "Danny Boy." In the cathedral's Chapter House Museum, see fascinating artifacts including the huge padlocks to Derry's original city gates. Later, you'll toast the day with a drink at a local pub before heading out for an hour or so of free-range wandering time before the ride back to the pier.

- Walk atop towering Old City walls considered some of the best-preserved in Europe.
- See and learn about Londonderry's medieval streets and landmarks from an excellent vantage point.
- Visit iconic Saint Columb's Cathedral and hear an Irish classic played by its organist.
- Stop in to a friendly pub for a sip of Irish drink, then take time to explore further at your leisure.
