OVERVIEW See the highlights of Pula – the largest city on the Istrian Peninsula – including its Roman amphitheater, which still hosts events. Pula has been inhabited since the Iron Age, which ended nearly 3,000 years ago, so it exudes history. While walking through the city, you will enjoy close-up views of the 2nd-century twin Roman gates, largely intact Roman walls and the Temple of Augustus, which had to be reconstructed after being bombed in World War II. The chapel of Saint Mary of Formosa is an early Christian monument that warrants a look as well. Still, Pula’s most revered landmark is its limestone Roman amphitheater, which like the similarly shaped Colosseum in Rome was constructed in the 1st century. It originally held up to 23,000 spectators, who were cooled by fountains that sprayed scented water that also masked the smell of blood in the arena. Starting off from the pier, you’ll first travel to Porec’s historic city center where you’ll see several noteworthy sites, including the St. Euphemia Basilica. Built in the 6th century, the Basilica is considered Porec’s most important monument and is a UNESCO World Heritage site. Following your guided tour of the town, you’ll be allowed some free time to stroll along the main streets of Cardo Maximus and Decumanus, discovering small shops and galleries while immersing yourself in Porec’s tranquil ambience. Re-joining your coach, it’s a short drive into the lush Istrian countryside to the quaint village of Kronicici. It is here that the Matosevic Family Winery is located, one of the most well-known wineries in Croatia. The Matosevic family themselves will warmly welcome you and after an informative overview of the winery, you’ll be invited to sample a selection of their wines, accompanied by some homemade cheese, Istrian Prsut and Fritule. As an added treat, you’ll be able to sample their Grappa as well. At the conclusion of your winery visit, you’ll be transferred back to the pier in Rovinj.
