After lunch on your own around Gendarmenmarkt square, you will stop at Checkpoint Charlie, the former border crossing between the East and West. Other landmarks include the Kaiser Wilhelm Church, the expansive square Alexanderplatz and the East Side Gallery, a lengthy remnant of the Berlin Wall with murals that celebrate freedom of expression.

You will also see Brandenburg Gate, where in 1987 President Ronald Reagan famously urged Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev to "tear down this wall"—referring to the Berlin Wall. Not far away stands the somber Holocaust memorial, a collection of concrete pillars that honors and remembers the millions of Jewish victims of the Holocaust. After lunch on your own around Gendarmenmarkt square, you will stop at Checkpoint Charlie, the former border crossing between the East and West. Other landmarks include the Kaiser Wilhelm Church, the expansive square Alexanderplatz and the East Side Gallery, a lengthy remnant of the Berlin Wall with murals that celebrate freedom of expression.

It remained there until 1961, when it was salvaged and some 14,000 pieces were meticulously reassembled. The result is a true wonder to behold.
