OVERVIEW

Interact with rescued elephants that are now living with dignity and respect in an elephant sanctuary. As an introduction, the staff will describe the elephants' prior lives, which often involved being exploited for labor in the logging industry. You will see firsthand how they are now treated ethically and humanely. You may watch these highly intelligent animals socializing, wading through water and rolling in the mud, which how elephants naturally cool down and protect their skin from the sun's harsh rays. Elephants consume hundreds of pounds of food each day, and you will have the opportunity to prepare a meal for them with ingredients such as bananas, sugar cane and watermelons. In the wild, elephants eat a remarkably wide array of plants, but the sanctuary elephants must be fed vitamin balls to supplement their diets. While observing the animals, you will likely notice their individual personalities and the caring manner in which they relate to each other.

OVERVIEW

Become thoroughly immersed in Koh Samui's culture by practicing yoga at a yoga studio and then trying to achieve inner peace at a meditation center. After departing from the pier, you will soon arrive at a museum devoted to coconuts, the main cash crop on Koh Samui. The island exports nearly two million coconuts each year and has become synonymous with the fruit. While browsing the enlightening exhibits, you can expect to see how organic virgin coconut oil is produced through fermentation and view numerous products made with coconuts that include cosmetics and

shampoos. You might even purchase unusual items such as coconut massage slippers. Continuing on, you will arrive at a Yoga Studio to practice yoga, a form of exercise introduced more than 5,000 years ago. Established in 1981, the park lies in the sheltered pale milky-green waters northeast of Phuket Island and is the location of more than 80 awe-inspiring islands. These unique karst formations were created when a collision of great magnitude occurred over 300 million years ago between the Indian subcontinent and mainland Asia. The force of the tectonic plates pushed and rotated what is now Thailand and Malaysia, forcing the limestone

above the surface. The resulting karst formations appear like fairy castles out of the sea and they come in all different shapes and sizes. Vegetation on the karsts has evolved to withstand long periods of dryness and an almost complete lack of soil. See spectacular flora hanging off the vertical rock faces and cascading down the cliffs including palm trees, bamboo, ferns and wild orchids. During your cruise enjoy a photo opportunity at the small island of Kao Ping-Gan, where part of the James Bond adventure "The Man with the Golden Gun" was filmed. Visit Koh Panyee, a picturesque village extending out across the water, resting precariously on small pilings. It is inhabited chiefly by Muslim fishermen who originally migrated from Indonesia. Cut off from the mainland and most modern amenities, their unique culture has existed for more than a hundred years. Following a buffet lunch, you will drive back to the ship. A short stop at a recommended shopping venue will be made en route.

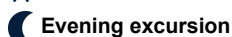
