OVERVIEW Stroll through one of the largest flower gardens in Japan, an urban oasis where something is always in bloom year-round. Colorful flowers carpet huge open areas in such abundance that the landscape looks like a painting. There are flowers in pots, on walls, in beds to make quilt-work patterns and hanging from greenhouse ceilings to reflect in the mirror-like ponds below. The setting is so beautiful that it is simply impossible to snap a bad photo. While you will be free to meander about the flower park on your own, don't miss the outdoor hot springs, where you will likely see visitors relaxing and soaking their feet in the soothing waters. There is even a beer garden that serves a variety of local brews.

NGO-007 NATIONAL TREASURE - INUYAMA CASTLE

OVERVIEW

Explore a 16th-century hilltop castle that is still relatively intact, one of many reasons that Japan has officially declared it a national treasure. Inuyama Castle perches atop a hill above the meandering Kiso River, a strategic location that has served it well since the castle was completed in 1537. Its soaring stone-and-wooden watchtower – known as a donjon – is one of the oldest in Japan. Climb its original steps for a panoramic view of the castle grounds and river, the same view that the samurai warriors once enjoyed. Elsewhere in the donjon, you will see a narrow underground passage that served to bottleneck invaders and some of the original building materials such as square steel nails. The castle also features an armory of samurai weapons, reminders that the castle was under a constant threat of attack. The one room in the donjon with tatami mats was reserved for the Naruse clan that owned the castle.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Meander through a largely intact 16th-century castle that is an official national treasure.
- See some of Inuyama Castle's hidden defensive mechanisms made to thwart invasions.
- Gaze out over the Kiso River from atop the castle's original watchtower.
- Browse a collection of artifacts relating to the Naruse family that once

owned the castle.

NGO-009 TOKONAME POTTERY TOWN

OVERVIEW

Delve into the great pottery tradition in Tokoname that first developed in the 12th century and became so culturally important that the town has been declared a Japan Heritage Site. As an introduction, you will browse the INAX Museums, a collection of buildings that hold industry-related items such decorative tiles, ornamental terracotta and a massive kiln for earthenware pipes. There is even a museum made of clay that displays some of the many uses of this versatile building material. Some of the buildings contain machinery and tools that will enhance your understanding of the ancient craft of pottery. Afterwards, you will walk through Old Town along an unusual footpath, part of which is lined with high walls of stacked pottery pipes and bottles. You will also pass century-old red-brick kiln chimneys, former pottery factories and small shops selling ceramics such as teapots and jars, all made from the iron-rich clays around Tokoname.

- Browse a collection of museums that reflect Tokoname's deep pottery heritage.
- See displays of elaborate ceramic tiles with Japanese, Islamic and Dutch designs.
- Gain insight into how Tokoname flourished as a pottery town because of its iron-rich clay.
- Stroll through Old Town on a path that showcases Tokoname's pottery.

You will see Tokugawa family treasures in the Tokugawa Art Museum, including period furniture, armor and ceramics for tea ceremonies. Many objects of art are from the peaceful Edo period,

which lasted from 1603 to 1868. More priceless artifacts await you at Atsuta Shrine, which is said to have been founded in the 3rd century to enshrine a sacred sword. While the sacred sword remains the most valuable item, the last person claiming to see it was a priest from the Edo period, who soon died from a mysterious curse. Even so, that hasn't deterred the pilgrims that come hoping that the sword will bless them with good luck.

OVERVIEW

Explore a Shinto shrine and Nagoya's namesake castle before enjoying a serene stroll through one of the city's traditional Japanese gardens. As you approach lovely Toyokuni Shrine, you will first notice the large Torii gate that leads to the entryway. The shrine is dedicated to Toyotomi Hideyoshi, who was born a peasant here in 1536 and rose to become a great feudal lord who unified Japan's warring political factions. Nagoya Castle is another architectural gem and was one of the largest castles in Japan until World War II, when most of it was destroyed. While browsing the replica castle, be sure to note the golden sea creatures on the roof that have become a symbol of Nagoya. For a respite from the hubbub of the city, you will stroll through Shiratori Garden, a green oasis meant to leave visitors with a great sense of ease and tranquility.

- Observe the splendor of a Shinto shrine dedicated to one of Japan's greatest feudal lords.
- Meander through 16th-century Nagoya Castle, which is still largely intact.

NGO-006 NAGOYA CASTLE & ATSUTA SHRINE

OVERVIEW

See culturally significant landmarks that reveal much about life in Nagoya centuries ago, one being a castle complex, the other a Shinto shrine. Tokugawa Ieyasu, the first Shogun of the Edo period, oversaw the construction of Nagoya Castle and the adjacent Honmaru Palace in the early 17th century. Although bombing during World War II destroyed both of them, they have been reconstructed to resemble the originals. Be sure to note the sea creatures adorning the castle's roof – which Nagoya has adopted as a city symbol – and the palace's glorious interior, especially the gold metalwork and exquisite paintings on the sliding doors. Atsuta Shrine was also heavily damaged during World War II and later restored to mirror the original. The shrine was supposedly founded in the 3rd century to hold a mythical imperial sword that hasn't been displayed since the 7th century. However, thousands of other artifacts are on exhibit, including weaponry and sacred garments.

HIGHLIGHTS

- View a replica of 17th-century Nagoya Castle, which was rebuilt after World War II.
- Admire the master craftsmanship and artwork that distinguishes Honmaru Palace.
- Visit a Shinto shrine supposedly founded in the 3rd century to house a sacred sword.
- Join the pilgrims at the shrine that hope the sword will bring them good luck.

OVERVIEW

Walk through an open-air museum of historical buildings that offer a rare glimpse into the Meiji Era, a time that brought about the modernization and Westernization of Japan. The era was relatively short – ending with the death of emperor Meiji in 1912 – but much was accomplished to make Japan a more open and powerful nation. As you will see at Meiji Mura, the architecture became more modern and was heavily influenced by Western styles. One of the museum highlights is the Frank Lloyd Wright-designed main entrance hall and lobby of Tokyo's iconic Imperial Hotel, which was moved to the museum piece by piece. Other attractions among the 60-some buildings include St. Francis Xavier's Cathedral, which was relocated from Kyoto, a prison, a sake brewery and Sapporo's telephone exchange, which reflects the technological advances that were made during the Meiji Era. Some of the buildings have been repurposed for cafés and stores.

OVERVIEW

Discover two vastly different aspects of Nagoya: its love of history at an ancient shrine and its reverence for innovation at a technology museum. Although the city was largely destroyed during World War II, it has been lovingly reconstructed, including fire-ravaged Atsuta Shrine. It was supposedly founded in the 3rd century when a legendary sacred sword was enshrined here. Over time, the Shinto shrine became a great spiritual center, and today thousands of artifacts are displayed, including holy garments, utensils for deities and ancient documents. In contrast, the Toyota Commemorative Museum of Industry and Technology celebrates industrial innovations. The museum is located in a 1911 factory for automatic looms in honor of Sakichi Toyoda, the inventor of Japan's first power loom and founder of the Toyota Group. The company name was later changed from Toyoda to Toyota in part because it requires only eight brush strokes to write in Japanese, and eight is a lucky number.

- Visit a Shinto shrine supposedly founded in the 3rd century to house a sacred sword.
- Join the pilgrims at the shrine that hope the sword will bring them good luck.
- Browse a museum that celebrates Toyota's industrial innovations.
- Discover the fascinating history of Toyota and the founder's inventions.

OVERVIEW

Browse an art museum renowned for its reproductions of the world's

greatest masterpieces and behold the tidal phenomenon of Japan's largest whirlpools. On the approach to the narrow Naruto Strait, you will notice the water's unusual turbulence, even from a distance. The whirlpools can be raging at times, particularly at high tide and low tide, when the currents violently swirl at dizzying speeds. The sheer size and power of the whirlpools can be mesmerizing, especially from the viewpoint, a glass-paneled walkway under the Onaruto Bridge. The Otsuka Museum of Art is compelling in a different way as it only displays replicas of great artwork. The museum's goal is to present a collection of world-famous art in one location that would otherwise be impossible. The thousand or so reproductions range from Picasso's seminal "Guernica" – the original of which is in Madrid – to Michelangelo's glorious paintings on the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel.

- See replicas of world-famous artwork in a museum that doesn't display originals.
- Gain an understanding of the museum's unique pioneering concept.
- Observe the massive whirlpools in Naruto Strait from a glass-paneled walkway.

OVERVIEW

Observe the natural phenomenon of Japan's largest whirlpools and see how Awa Odori dance became a cultural phenomenon, especially in Tokushima. The Naruto Whirlpools are incredibly, even dangerously powerful. They are even more dynamic at high and low tides and at certain times of the year. These eddies are formed as the seawater rushes through the narrow Naruto Strait between Awaji and Shikoku islands. The unique topography of the strait's deep, v-shaped bottom adds to the intensity of the whirlpools. The glass-paneled walkway under the Onaruto Bridge is one of the best places to view the swirling waters. Browsing the Awa Odori Kaikan museum will add another dimension to your appreciation for this part of Japan. The exhibits are entirely dedicated to traditional Awa Odori dance. It is so popular that the annual Awa Odori festival in Tokushima draws more than a million people. You will understand the attraction after viewing the museum's displays.

- Observe the large, frighteningly powerful whirlpools in Naruto Strait.
- Learn what causes the whirlpools and when the currents are most violent.
- Browse a museum whose sole focus is traditional Awa Odori dance.

OVERVIEW

Discover the Japanese art of indigo dyeing in a hands-on workshop and visit a Buddhist temple that marks the beginning of a 750-mile pilgrimage route. Tokushima has long been known for its traditional indigo dyeing, a technique known as aizome. The dye comes from the leaves of a species of indigo plant that is cultivated throughout the prefecture. The history of indigo and the process of extracting the natural dye is fascinating as you will learn in this immersive class, during which you will create your own blue-dyed textiles. In the nearby town of Naruto, you will explore Ryozen-ji temple, the first of the 88 temples on the Shikoku Pilgrimage route, a significant spiritual journey for Buddhists as each temple represents a stage on the path to enlightenment. Chances are, you will see pilgrims following in the footsteps of the 9th-century monk and poet Kobo-Daishi, who founded the Shingon school of Buddhism.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Discover the history of Japanese indigo dyeing, a traditional art known as aizome.
- Create your own blue-dyed indigo textile in a hands-on class.
- Visit the first of 88 Buddhist temples on a pilgrimage route.
- Gain insight into the importance of the pilgrimage in Buddhism.

OVERVIEW

Meander through a historical district full of Edo Period homes that feature an unusual architectural element and tour one of the more impressive residences. This former district for merchants lies within the town of Mima, once known as the fortified castle town of Wakimachi. It flourished centuries ago from the production of washi paper, which was used for books and screen room dividers. Many of the district's beautifully preserved residences feature udatsu, unique high-winged wall structures on the roofs that were built to prevent fires from spreading. Because udatsu was expensive, it was considered a sign of wealth and prestige. Although most of the homes have been altered to better suit contemporary life, the Yoshida residence has been beautifully preserved just as it was in 1792. Inside, you will gain an understanding of how one of the town's wealthiest indigo merchants and his family lived in five buildings arranged around a Zen garden.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Walk through an Edo-period merchant district where only the wealthiest owned homes.
- Notice the unique udatsu fire-prevention element built into the more expensive homes.
- Browse the interior of an affluent indigo merchant's well-preserved

residence.

- Gain an understanding of the Edo period, when the arts and Japanese culture flourished.

The higher you ascend on the ropeway, the more spectacular the views, especially if the day is clear and you can see all the way to Awaji Island and the Kii Mountains beyond. Nearly 1,000 feet high, Bizan looms over the urban sprawl of Tokushima and is so revered that it has become a symbol for the city. Awa Odori dance is equally synonymous with Tokushima as you will discover while browsing the Awa Odori Kaikan museum. The exhibits beautifully display dance costumes and musical instruments and describe in detail how this 400-year-old art form has evolved. Still, the highlight will be watching an Awa Odori performance, which can be wildly energetic or exquisitely elegant.

For a glimpse into the local culture in the 17th-century, you will visit Kochi Castle, an extraordinary building that has endured invasions, fires and natural disasters. One of a dozen Japanese castles with its original keep and palace, the castle is an architectural gem with a wooden interior that reflects the style of the Edo

It requires climbing a set of steep, boulder-strewn "demon steps" with the aid of handrails, but it is well worth the effort. Fresh seafood is the allure of Jagalchi Fish Market, where every imaginable fish and exotic sea creature is displayed on ice. Both markets are excellent venues for people-watching and to observe daily life.

OVERVIEW

Stroll a boardwalk that winds through boiling geothermal springs known as Unzen Hell and then visit Shimabara castle, which a cruel feudal lord built in the 17th century. A magma reservoir at the bottom of a nearby bay causes the steaming, hissing landscape of Unzen Hell, which is of geological and historical interest. Here, between 1627 and 1632, dozens of Christians were executed by being thrown into the boiling waters to suppress the spread of Christianity, which had been introduced to Japan about 100 years earlier. A plaque stands at Unzen Hell to commemorate the martyrs. The struggles of Japan's early Christians are also detailed at Shimabara Castle, which was built by the lord that ordered the Christians to be murdered at Unzen Hell. The museum inside the castle showcases the ordeals of Christians at the time and their uprising in the Shimabara Rebellion. The five-tiered castle is a reproduction of the original, except for the stone foundation and moat that survived intact.

- Discover why Christians were boiled alive in its geothermal springs in the early 1600s.

While Arita is considered the birthplace of Japanese porcelain, Nagasaki will forever be remembered for the devastating atomic bomb that was dropped here. As you meander through the Peace Memorial Park, you can take a moment to reflect on the bomb's effects.

You will see some of those artifacts at the Shoko Shuseikan Museum.

OVERVIEW

Discover the natural beauty of volcanic Japan by cruising to Sakurajima, one of the country's most active volcanoes and the beloved symbol of Kagoshima. As you cruise across Kinko Bay, you will be treated to a unique perspective of the volcano, which smokes and erupts almost daily, although fortunately not in a major way. However, an eruption in 1914 was so massive that when the lava flow hardened it bridged the bay, connecting an island just off shore to Osumi Peninsula. Upon arriving at the port, you will visit the Arimua Observatory, which sits atop a volcanic hill formed by another eruption. It is one of the few places in the world where you can safely view a highly active volcano. There are numerous lookout decks that will offer a variety of viewpoints of towering Sakurajima.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Cruise to a peninsula where you will behold one of Japan's most active volcanoes up close.
- Expect to see the volcano belching smoke and perhaps even feel a minor eruption.
- Discover how past major eruptions have shaped the surrounding landscape.
- Enjoy several perspectives of the volcano from the lookouts at Arimua Observatory.

- Dress in weather-appropriate clothing.
- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes.

KOJ-006 SENGANEN GARDEN & MUSEUM

OVERVIEW

Discover the exquisite flora at Sengan-en Garden and delve in Kagoshima's industrial history by browsing a museum with artifacts from one of Japan's earliest machinery factories. Both attractions are so spectacular that UNESCO declared them World Heritage sites. The garden is a botanical oasis built to complement the 17th-century residence of one of Japan's most influential feudal lords. It couldn't be lovelier, especially with majestic Mount Sakurajima towering in the background. It surrounds the former villa of the powerful Shimazu clan. A few centuries later, a descendant of the clan built Japan's first Western-style factory in Kagoshima to produce armaments, glass, ceramics and farm tools. You will see some of those artifacts at the Shoko Shuseikan Museum, including personal items from the Shimazu clan and fine Satsuma porcelain. Even the building is significant, as it was the first western-style stone building in Japan with arches.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Stroll through the 17th-century botanical oasis Sengan-en Garden, a World Heritage site.
- See how the garden was built to complement the Shimazu clan's 17th-century residence.
- Browse a museum with artifacts from a factory that a Shimazu clan descendant built.
- Admire the museum structure, Japan's first western-style stone building with arches.
